I am writing with some bittersweet news. I have accepted a new role as Associate Superintendent here at Minneapolis Public Schools, which means that I will no longer serve as principal. For the last seven years, you have been so supportive, and I am grateful for the time I had to learn with and from you! More importantly, thank you for trusting me as the principal of Henry High School, with your child.

When I accepted the principal position, I never set eyes on being an associate superintendent or a superintendent. Instead, I wanted to be the best principal I could possibly be for the Henry community. I feel I have what it takes to serve the broader community in a time of need. One thing that I learned from the Henry community is that if we spend the necessary time together with purpose, hard work and love we can be one PHamily. It is my goal for MPS to be one family.

It is my pleasure to announce that Ms. Liza Anderson Schmid will be the principal of Henry as of August 1, 2022. Ms. Anderson Schmid was assistant principal at Henry High School from July 2014 - June 2021. For the past year, she led Field Elementary as principal. She has more than 20 years of experience in education and started her career as a middle school science teacher in the Mounds View School district. Throughout her career, she has focused on meeting the individual needs of students while using data to help drive decision-making.

Principal Anderson Schmid graduated from Concordia College with degrees in biology and earth science. She also holds a master's degree in Curriculum Development and Instruction and an Educational Specialist degree in K-12 Administration from the University of St. Thomas. She also completed her K-12 principal licensure at the University of St. Thomas.

I know that the community will come together and support Interim Principal Anderson Schmid. Henry will go through the process to select a permanent leader in the spring of 2023.

FOUNDATION BOARD SPOTLIGHT & SCHOLARSHIPS

Cathy Roehl Peterson—Class of 1965

Back in the mid 1990's, when I was the Athletic Director at South High School, Don Swanson who was the Henry Athletic Director asked me to start a Foundation and Hall of Fame at Henry. In 1999 when I retired, Ann Kaari, Henry alumni and former Minneapolis school board member and chair, and I put our heads together and recruited a number of friends to start the Henry Foundation. By doing so, Wynn Wallin, former CEO of Medtronic, assured us there would be scholarship money available for Henry students through the Foundation. We couldn't *not* start a foundation.

We started with zero dollars. But we also found that not only were scholarships important, but everyday immediate needs of teachers and staff to help students were also important. Teacher requests for funding through the school district could take months – if ever – to be approved, while the Foundation could approve requests and the money would be there overnight.

I am the last living Foundation founder and have stayed with the Foundation because the good I see it plays in Henry's staff and students' lives. I have held every office on the Board and work with the Hall of Fame committee. Each year, raising money gets harder and harder and the needs get larger and larger, but the satisfaction of helping the very school that gave me the basis for my lifelong success brings me great joy. An added benefit is it has also kept me connected to my own classmates and alumni from other classes.

Judy Borman Fehn—Class of 1965

I am Judy Borman Fehn from the Class of 1965. I was very anxious to graduate high school and move on. My memories of high school were like many: a lot were good and some not so good. I have attended most of my class reunions and was always anxious to attend. I enjoyed meeting up with classmates and seeing those who were changing with the times and those who didn't. There are many classmates to this day I still consider true friends.

I was asked what class left the greatest impression on me. It was my 9th grade English class with Mrs. Randle, and we studied Greek Mythology. The stories fascinated me which made me the eclectic reader that I am today. My college degree wasn't English but rather Biology.

About 5 years ago I was asked to attend a Foundation meeting and to consider becoming a member. I was impressed how the group made their decisions based upon the Foundations goals and objectives: 1) How will students benefit? 2) How can the staff benefit? 3) How does the school benefit? These criteria are used to make all decisions. Yes, Henry has changed but, a lot is the same. We have all changed. But I do know being a graduate of Henry has left an impression on me. For that reason, I appreciate the opportunity to be part of the Foundation.

Laura (Wincek) Hudoba—Class of 1965

In 2006, at a post class reunion committee meeting, Brad Thorsen and Cathy Roehl Peterson, who at the time were current Foundation Board members, asked me to attend a PHHS Foundation Board meeting. I accepted the invitation and attended a meeting. After watching, listening, and learning during three meetings, a motion was approved to accept me as the newest Board member. I accepted and I have served as President and Vice President during my tenure as a Board member.

Realizing the daily needs and challenges teachers and staff face at Patrick Henry, the importance of the Foundation became clear with each Board meeting. The needs are many and the results from donations are appreciated by staff and scholarship recipients. It is a pleasure to serve on the Foundation as we continue to pursue future members and donations.
