## **Foundation President's Message**

By now you are probably aware the high school many of us attended will officially have the name changed to Camden High School effective July 1, 2024. In 2022, the Minneapolis School Board voted to direct the school to take actions to change the name. In spring 2023, the name was selected by a rank voting process open to students, staff, alumni and community. The Minneapolis Public School Board approved the name choice last fall, and determined the gender neutral name of Scottish descent meaning "winding valley" is a reflection of the area on the upper half of the north side where the building resides, and believes the name can be accepted by the community going forward. Although I believe some alumni did not support changing the name, the current students, staff, and area residents took the steps they felt were needed to make the school better represent the current community the school serves.

Young adults have often used activism to facilitate change and the generations of their parents and grandparents have not been in favor of the causes. We should welcome the idea that through activism change can happen which leads to progress and a better future. So although the identity of the building has changed, education and learning still happens inside the school. Intellectual, social, physical and emotional learning was enhanced by our teachers, administrators, friends, and activities while we attended the school. We rallied around the school by donning scarlet and gray, sang the fight song, participated in activities and sports, or cheered in the stands. These experiences will continue at the school for future generations under the new name. I hope that alumni can come to terms with this change while supporting the current students as they grow and become alumni and productive citizens of the future.

The Foundation Board hopes you will continue to champion the students and activities at Camden High School. This can be in the form of time, talent and/or financial donations to programs that will enhance learning opportunities. No matter what the name of the building, the goal of the school is to educate young people to embrace learning, developing life skills and so much more.

In May the Foundation will be electing officers for the following board cycle. If you are interested in attending board meetings or becoming a board member/director, we could use you now more than ever. Recently some board members determined they needed to step away from Foundation duties. We encourage anyone who is interested to join the small group of alumni and staff who make up the Foundation Board. Your involvement will directly affect the lives of the students and staff in a positive way.

I was initially hired as a general helper at District Energy St. Paul and simultaneously enrolled in courses taught by Dave's father at Hennepin Technical College. Through this experience, I gained knowledge about how a district heating system operates and how to handle equipment such as boilers and turbines. Over the years, I have been promoted to the position of Plant Superintendent, where I oversee the facility's operations.

I am fully aware that I wouldn't have had this opportunity without the support of my community and, most importantly, my friend Dave. Now, I feel that I have a chance to give back to the community by actively participating with the foundation to help with funding to enhance the school experiences of both students and staff.

- Purchase a new printer and replacement ink cartridges for the Nurse's office.
- Growing the Track & Field program. Participation has skyrocketed. Alumni welcome to lend a hand!
- School staff t-shirts to wear at school events, special days at school, and when staff visit students at home before school starts in the fall.
- Henry students are learning poetry, fiction and spoken word that is relevant to their lives. Funds were provided for a visiting spoken word artist and to purchase copies of the book for every student in two classes.

- A teacher's plan to host an event for all students and families to share Latino cultural information, educational content, food, art projects and music. Latino students are the most common refugee students coming to Henry.
- Several Henry programs are aimed directly at increased graduation rates. Each
  program is led by adults who build warm relationships with students to increase
  attendance or to increase success in academics. Students can earn awards such

Henry staff have been rebuilding the Cheerleading programs. District funds do not cover their uniforms, so last year the Foundation contributed \$1000 about one-third of the actual cost. This year, many more students tried out and some made the squad, so the Foundation voted to support the team again. ~Davianna
