

What is An Elder

- A distinctive feature of reformed identity.
- Elders alongside leaders have responsibility for spiritual care of the local church.
- Elders are elected by the local Church. (As people with spiritual gifts aides the church.)
- Elders' are at the heart of the local church. (Offers the impetus/leadership for mission, witness, service & fruitful life as God's Servants)

A Licensed Minister

- Outward sign of God's call => Spiritual guidance.
- License is conditional. Authorizes a minister to perform all ministerial functions under the local church.
- Subject to the terms of the license to only act as clergy in the context of a local congregation and/or mentoring leader.
- Some licenses issued restrict activities to performing specific duties, such as preaching, while not permitting a minister to officiate at weddings or funerals.
- Others allow licensed ministers to perform all rites and sacraments, but only within the supervising local church.



Ordination

- Reflects Elders as integral part of Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries.
- Pordination as an Elder of the Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries so your ordination is recognized across denominations.
- Being an Elder/Minister is a privilege and responsibility The key element is being part of a team which needs the ability to listen and follow the will of God.



Elders in the Old Testament

- Exodus 3:16 and 18:12
 - ✓ The Elders spoke for & acted on behalf of the people.
- Numbers 11:16-25
 - ✓ God directs 70 Elders to be chosen to work with Moses.
 - ✓ To do a job/meet a need; a group dependent on God and equipped by God for the task.
- As Israelites settled in Palestine each city had its body of Elders in admin. & judicial functions (Deuteronomy 25:5-10)
- As well as local Elders there was a national body the "Elders of Israel" which became the Sanhedrin.
- Other refs: Deuteronomy 19:12, Joshua 8:10 & 2Samuel 5:3

The Early Church had Elders ...

- Probably based on models in Judaism
 - ✓ Unlike Jewish Elders, Church
 Elders did not become secular
 rulers but administrators of local
 churches
- Main references to Elders are in Acts and the 'Pastoral Epistles' (1 Timothy & Titus)
- NT does not say where Elders came from



The Modern Church

Reforming Mindset: Apostolic

We can define the apostolic ministry as 'influencing and transforming the world we are in – locally, regionally or globally – with the values of Heaven'.

Outreach Focus: Evangelistic

We can define the evangelistic ministry as 'revealing King Jesus to those who don't know Him, through words, works and wonders'.



Training Environment: Teaching

We can define the teaching ministry as 'communicating biblical truth through teaching and training to see transformation'.

Encounter Atmosphere: Prophetic

We can define the prophetic ministry as 'connecting people to the Presence of God so they see, hear and feel Him for themselves'.

Shepherding Heart: Pastoral

We can define the pastoral ministry as 'cultivating Kingdom character and community through coaching, counseling, and care'.

What We Are Looking For!

Eternal Life Fellowship, we look for Elders and Ministers to be "FAT":

- 1. Faithful
- 2. Accountable &
- 3. Trainable & Teachable

New Ministers are Asked...

- Do they love God and one another?
- Do they have a heart to make disciples?
- Do they have FAITH?
 - F: Fruitful
 - A: Available
 - I: Integrity
 - T: Teachable/Trainable
 - H: Humble & Submissive
- Do they model a Christian walk?



Ministry Authority

- The ultimate authority over the credential is the Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries, along with the Board of Ministerial Standards (BOMS).
- Those credentialed in the Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries have been approved by a local fellowship church, a district council (DBOMS) and the National BOMS.
- An Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries credential is a non-denominational credential and is granted to candidates "in trust."
- This means the candidate is accountable to the Eternal Life Fellowship
 Ministries through the local church and the credential does not belong to
 the individual.
- Elders & Ministers serve at the pleasure of the Servant Leader.

Spiritual Leadership



Two Key Elements:

- 1. Leadership by the Spirit By ordination we request that Elders are empowered by the Holy Spirit to undertake ministry in the church.
- 2. Leadership of the Spirit Elders are also expected to lead the mission of their local church by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Servant Leadership

- Elders need to be people of prayer, who through Bible study are able to discern God's will for them.
- Elders need to be servants of the church.
- We all sit at the feet of Jesus.
- Serve at the Pleasure of the Servant Leader.



Scope of Ministry

Scripture clearly teaches that each believer has been given a grace-gift(s) in order to serve our Lord and His Church. (Ephesians 4)

✓ Some believers have received the call of God upon their lives for ministry and have been given a grace-gift(s) for the task of preparing God's people to carry out the works of the ministry which builds up the body of Christ



Scope of Ministry

It is those in vocational ministry whom God Himself has chosen and appointed, whom the local church affirms, and who are subsequently recognized by the Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries by the act of the pouring of oil & the laying on of hands.

(Acts 13:3, 1 Timothy 4:14 & II Timothy 1:6)

Rationale & Benefits of Credentialing

The rationale for and benefits of credentialing are the following:

- A. Recognition of God's calling to and gifting for vocational ministry,
- B. Interdependency between the local church, the district and the national office, to ensure a commitment to and alignment of beliefs (Statement of Faith) and ethos,
- C. Accountability to the local church and to the denomination, both doctrinally and morally,
- D. Development educationally and personally, and
- E. Confirmed legal status by the IRS via ELFGN

Credentialing Categories

- A. License: (This is issued conditionally) Authorizes you to operate in your gift under the Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries & Global Network banner. Sponsored by your local church.
- **B.** Ordination: (This is issued for life) Acknowledges and recognizes God's calling you to operate your gift in ministry.
- C. Commission: (This is issued conditionally and requires Discipleship in the ELFGN). Approves you to fully operate (independently) with the full support and covering of Eternal Life Fellowship Ministries & Global Network banner.

Purpose of Credentialing

The purpose of a ministerial credential is to:

- 1. Affirm God's call upon a person's life
- 2. Verify that this person meets the qualifications and standards for ministry in the ELFGN
- Approve this person for ministerial service under the auspices of the ELFGN
- 4. **Provide** legal status in the exercise of that person's ministry

Ordination

- Is the rite by which people whom God has called to be confirmed by the church and are set apart by prayer, the pouring of oil and the laying of the hands.
- It is the recognition of a particular calling from God and its acceptances by an individual.
- Ordination gives full authorization to perform duties and exercise the prerogatives of the local church.



Your Place in Ministry

- In God's big church there is room for many different kinds of people doing many different kinds of ministry.
- You will be able to take personality profiles, spiritual gift inventories, a Ministry Strengths and Gifts Survey, and other tools to guide you in your search for the perfect ministerial fit for you.
