Ministry Care Models

- 1. Some Ministers work together to care for people in a 'sector' or 'region'.
- 3. Appropriate members of the congregation forming 'Ministry Care Teams'.
- 5. From amongst the church some are set a side for Ministry Care.

Why Ministry Care Matters

- The Old Testament shows God to be like a compassionate parent Hosea 11:1-4
- * Love is at the heart of Christianity ...
 - …"as God's chosen people, holy and loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility" Col 3:12
 - ✓ … "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another as I have loved you …" John 13:34
- Jesus' healing ministry shows that Ministry care transforms lives just as mission has the potential to be life changing.



Ministry Oversight

- * To have an overview & give consideration to the needs of the whole Church and individuals. (Life Shape Triangle)
- * Tomake sure that an effective system of Ministry care is put in place.
- * Totake responsibility for the outworking of the system (not necessarily being the ones carrying out the care directly).
 - * To make sure that individuals and/or groups do not fall through the net.
 - * To check and evaluate that things are being done well.
 - * To support the work that is happening and those doing the work.
 - Tomake sure that communication works well, so that the needs of people are not missed and that people feel affirmed.



- * To discuss matters of policy which affect Ministry care e.g.
 - * What do we mean by confidentiality?
 - * What have we got to do about child protection?
- * To pray for those in Ministry need and for those who do the caring.
- To be aware of agencies for referral Social Services, Counselling, Medical Centers, Homeless Shelters



- ★ Three Functions of Ministry Care.
- * What is the difference between *ensuring* and doing Ministry Care.
- ★ Former is about Ministers' *responsibility*....
 ➤while latter is about an appropriate *strategy*.
 ➤ => Ministers (& minister/s) not only ones to do it.
- * **GOOD PRACTICE** ensures appropriate methods to be used for young people & vulnerable adults.





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Scripture - John 5:1-15

- * Healing of man at pool
- * The Father sees the man & knows his condition
- * Jesus deals with the problem not the circumstances
- * The Father does the follow-up



Ministry Care

Aspects to Consider

- Caring is first & foremost an ATTITUDE and it is a task of the ENTIRE church body. (Life Shape Pentagon)
- * Aspects of caring by Ministers: (Life Shape Triangle)
 - 1) Taking care of yourself
 - 2) Caring for each other as Ministers
 - 3) Developing a 'Ministry Strategy' for the community.
- * Caring is both 'reflective listening' & understanding...
- * Church must be Consistent, Practical, and Realistic (CPR).

Ministry Care

Taking Care of Yourself (Mind-Body-Soul)

- * Feelings of inadequacy having a reliance on God! (Life Shape Circle)
- * Responsibility *Know your boundaries!* You are NOT a social worker!
- * Praying for yourself.
- * Getting good rest, exercise, and eating correctly.
- * Growing your own faith.
- * Knowing your church.
- * Working with others when possible? (Know when to refer!)




Communication

- * What is "communication"?

- **1. Sharing of Emotions & Feelings**
- **2. Exchanging Ideas/Judgements**
- 3. Reporting Facts about Others
- 4. Complete Emotional & Personal Truths
- 5. Cliché Conversation



Blocks to Communication

- * Use of particular words.
- * Being defensive and not open.
- * Judging a person or being critical.
- * Attempting to solve people's problems.
- * Avoiding the issue or being dismissive.
- * Being unaware of your verbal and non-verbal communication.
- * Being a poor listener. (We have two ears for a reason!)

Listening Skills

- Listening means hearing words, but also picking up what is beneath the words
- So what are we listening to?
 - Their words
 - ✓ Tone of Their Voice
 - ✓ Silences
 - Thoughts & Themes
 - Emotions

Guidelines for Listening

- Enable and encourage the SPEAKER.
- LISTEN to their words & pauses...
 - SHOW that you are listening, using few words but especially with your "body language".
 - No Distractions (Cell Phone!)
 - RESPONDING in an accepting, (non-judgmental) way.
 - ASKING questions when you do not understand.
 - REFLECTING back to the speaker.
 - ✓ SUMMARISING every so often.
 - Avoid preemptive answers.

Ministry Care & Discipleship

- Learn from visits and chats with other church members and discuss... (Life Shape Circle) in small groups:
 - As a visitor how comfortable do you feel discussing matters of faith, God and discipleship?
 - What would you feel you were offering in this situation and what would you expect to receive from the encounter?
- Are there particular Ministers you would see as being gifted to listen to & discuss faith matters with?



Good Practices

- Clearly state your name & that the visit is on behalf of the church and ask "May I come in"
- * Establish how regular future visits should be.
- * Be prepared to receive—even a cup as gift.
- * If you state you will do something, then **DO!**
- Keep things in confidence unless permission is given to share the information.
- If someone has a criticism encourage them.

Additional Good Practices

- Phone calls or note through the door can be a substitute for a visit but not all the time!
- * When appropriate you can invite people to their home for a family dinner or cookout. (Use wisdom!)
- If you feel conversations are moving into an uncomfortable topic, STOP and say so and then refer this to a professional counselor or another minister or those with experience in the areas needed.

Advise

- * Keep Records of Each Household (Good Apps for this!)
 - Names, relationships, occupations, interests, skills
 - Church involvement (past and present)
 - Special events: birthdays, anniversaries, deaths dates you have visited.
 - ✓ Matters for referral: e.g. minister, home group leader
- Limit your time to about 20 30 minutes
- * Have An Aim for Each Visit e.g. topic of conversation
- Make an Effort to Raise the Spirituality of the *Congregation.



- "Ordinary" Contact Visits
 - Advance preparation
 - Getting into the home
 - ✓ The visit
 - Concluding the visit





Types of Visits

- * Special Visits
 - ✓ Prospective members
 - \checkmark The Sick
 - ✓ The Housebound
 - TheAlcoholic
 - ✓ The Dying
 - ✓ The Bereaved
