GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All general rules and regulations for the CMR Farm Show apply to the Beef Department. In addition, **ONLY** exhibitors that are showing in the CMR Beef Department are eligible to assist other CMR beef livestock exhibitors in the ring.
2. Record books must be **fully** completed and turned into the Extension Office **by September 30th 2019**.
3. Animals must be in the exhibitor's stall from 8:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. every day of the show. Animals not in sale may be removed from the grounds after 4 p.m. on Sunday.
4. **All BEEF ANIMALS** are the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed, water, and maintain their stall until 6 p.m. Monday.
5. All stalls must be kept clean and animals watered throughout the entire time at the CMR Farm Show.
6. All beef animals must be halter broken. Nose leads and tranquilizers are prohibited. The Beef Committee will have the authority to remove any animal that they feel is unruly or that is considered a safety hazard.
7. An exhibitor may show no more than two steers, two heifers, two cow/calf, or two cows per class. No limit on bred and owned classes. Standard entry forms are **due 6/8/2019**.
8. Bred and owned commercial and registered purebred heifers must be out of a dam owned by the exhibitor at the time the dam is bred.
9. All CMR Livestock entries must be on an official PROJECT Entry form. Registered Purebred heifer's, cow/calf, and cow's classes **MUST HAVE** a copy of their registration papers attached **with** their entry form. **NO** late registration papers will be accepted. Otherwise entry (s) will automatically be entered into a commercial class. Calves may be pending.
10. Entry fee is **\$8.00** per head for non-sale animals and **\$25.00** per head for sale animals. **Fees are non-refundable.** (Sale animal entry fee includes buyer's rosette, buyer reception, buyer recognition, and entry fee.) Any late entries received or postmarked **after 6/8/19 will be charged double entry fees.**
11. Premiums for type classes will be: 1st - \$6, 2nd - \$5, 3rd - \$4, 4th - \$3, 5th - \$2, 6th - \$1
12. Bred and Owned: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$6, 4th - \$4, 5th - \$2.
13. Showmanship: Classes will be done in heats with premiums given out: 1st - \$12, 2nd - \$10, 3rd - \$8, 4th - \$6, 5th - \$4, 6th - \$2.
14. All exhibitors **MUST** participate in the Beef Showmanship Contest using **their OWN** project animal unless approved by the Beef Department Chairman (s).
15. Cattle in the Beef Show may be clipped, washed, brushed or combed. Only conditioning sprays and sheens are allowed. **NO** glue, adhesives, paints, artificial add-ons, etc. No other material may be used. If caught using you will be **IMMEDIATELY DISQUALIFIED** from the CMR Beef Show. (which also means that you will not be able to sell your animal)
16. ALL CMR beef livestock exhibitors are expected to **fit (see rule #15)** their own project animal with minimum assistance from a family member or other CMR Beef Livestock exhibitor.
17. All beef exhibitors, especially senior members, are expected to be responsible for the care of their animals with minimum help from family members or other CMR livestock exhibitors.
18. The alley way near the show ring is to be kept clear of all personal items.
19. Mandatory neck ropes on all cattle.
20. **Absolutely NO tie-outs, holding pens, or similar are allowed outside the designated beef department area. If there is space within the beef barn for evening tie-outs, the Beef Department Chairman (s) will make that decision.**
21. There will be designated areas for fitting of livestock. **ALL** fitting requiring blowers, clippers, or other electrical usage must be done in this area only.
22. Blowers must have their own generators and be located outside and in the designated fitting area.
23. Health Requirements: Beef Chairman (s) will have a veterinarian check **ALL** animals for general good health. Any animal deemed unfit or possessing any contagious condition by the veterinarian will **NOT** be allowed in the barn and sent home immediately.
24. Animals are expected to be in the waiting area and ready to go in the ring when their class is called.
25. Tack spaces will be assigned based on the following: 1 family- 4 foot space/2 families- 8 foot space/3 or more families –

12 foot space. This tack rule only applies to the exhibitors that are on the last two rows near the show ring and cow/calf pens. All other exhibitors have the alley way behind them. We will make every attempt to grant your request, but will not guarantee that the request will be honored due to limited space. If you are stalling with another family, you will need to let the Beef Department Chairman (s) know prior to **6/8/2019**.

26. THE DECISION OF YOUR DEPARTMENT CHAIRMAN (S) IS FINAL!

HEIFER, COW/CALF AND COW SHOW RULES

1. All heifers must be in the possession of the exhibitor and purebreds registered in the exhibitor's name by the following dates:
 - Junior Yearling Heifers (born 1/1/18 to 4/30/18) - **Registered by- January 1, 2019**
 - Summer Yearling Heifers (born 5/1/18 to 8/31/18) - **Registered by- February 15, 2019**
 - Senior Heifer Calves (born 9/1/18 to 12/31/18) - **Registered by- May 1, 2019**If a heifer project should die, the Beef Department Chairman (s) must be notified immediately. If a replacement heifer can be found 100 days before the CMR Farm Show, it is eligible to be shown if it meets all other qualifying criteria. **See Deadline dates for registration.**
2. Purebred Heifer registration papers and tattoos may be checked at the CMR Farm Show by the Beef Department Chairman (s).
3. Heifers will be shown by age.
4. In the Cow/Calf and Cow classes, the cow must have been owned and shown as a heifer by the exhibitor at CMR.
5. For registered purebred heifers if there are four or more entries in a particular breed, then they will have their own show. All others will go in All Other Breed classes (AOB). Animals with NO registration papers are considered commercial.
6. In the Cow classes it must not have a calf with it at the CMR Farm Show.

STEER SHOW RULES

1. **Steer must have been born after January 1, 2018.**
2. All Steers must be weighed in at the Culpeper location to be able to show and sell. Steers must either be properly castrated or banded (castration = complete removal of testicles) before January weigh in.
3. Steers will be shown by weight.
4. All steers must be owned and in the possession and care of the exhibitors by **January 5th, 2019**. If the project steer should die, the Beef Department Chairman (s) must be **notified IMMEDIATELY**. The exhibitor may replace it with a similar animal. If a replacement steer can be found 100 days before the CMR Farm Show, it is eligible to be shown if it meets all other qualifying criteria. The replacement steer will **NOT** be eligible for prizes in the carcass contest or average daily gain.
5. Market steers will be shown by weight. The Beef Department Chairman (s) has the final say in which class an animal is shown.
6. **To be eligible for the Grand/Reserve Champion Steer, Sale, and Carcass classes, a steer must have a minimum weight of 1000 pounds and a minimum quality grade of Select minus.**
7. The Grand Champion and Reserve Champion steer must sell in the sale unless both are owned by one exhibitor, in that case, the Grand Champion must sell.
8. All steers exhibiting any secondary bull characteristics at the CMR Farm Show will be ineligible for the show, sale, or carcass contest.
9. An exhibitor may sell only one steer in the sale
10. All Dairy Beef and Beef steers will be combined together and shown by weight.

RULES AND REGULATIONS – BEEF

1. All Steers will be weighed in **July 11th, 2019** and ultrasound of the animals will take place at approx. 10:30 am. (Ultrasound date could possibly change due to availability)
2. Carcass data will be recorded by ultrasound, and class placing will be determined by using a profitability formula approved by the Beef Committee. Beef breeds and dairy beef breeds will be ranked separately.
3. **Premiums will be based on donations received.**
4. Steers are identified by a numbered ear tag assigned by the Beef Department Chairman (s) at the time the animal is weighed-in during the January 5th weigh-in.
All steers must be weighed in at the Culpeper location to participate in carcass contest.
5. An exhibitor **may be** allowed to enter a maximum of two steers (pending ADG and grade) at the discretion of the Beef Department Chairman (s).
6. To be considered for Grand and Reserve Champion, steer or steers must have:
 - a. A minimum carcass grade of Choice Minus
 - b. An average daily gain that meets or exceeds the average ADG for all steers entered in the contest
 - c. A yield grade 3.4 or less for carcass quality grade Ch+ or higher; a yield grade of 3.1 or less for carcass quality grade Mid-Choice, a yield grade 2.9 or less for carcass quality grade Ch-.
 - d. Maximum Carcass weight of 950 pounds
6. All steers will be considered to receive a Virginia Junior Feeder Meat Type Steer Certification from the Virginia Beef Cattle Improvement Association, if they meet the qualifications.
7. The Carcass Awards Picnic will be announced at a later date. The Carcass Committee will arrange the picnic.
8. **ENTRY FEE WILL BE \$25.00 PER HEAD TO COVER THE COST OF THE ULTRASOUND.**
9. If we are unable to find an ultrasound technician we will only be doing ADG.
