# ◆ <u>GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS</u> ◆

- 1. All general rules and regulations for the CMR Farm Fair apply to the Goat Department.
- 2. Only 4-H/FFA Members actively enrolled in a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter in Culpeper, Madison or Rappahannock Counties are eligible to exhibit in the Goat Department.
- 3. All goats must be owned or under the care of the exhibitors by May 5, 2021. All market kids to be shown must be officially tagged-in and weighed-in from 5 to 6:30pm on May 5, 2021 at the Ag Enterprises. An exhibitor may tagin up to 3 kids from which to choose their market kids. All 3 can be shown, only 2 can be sold, must meet weight limits. Exhibitors must complete their weigh-in forms properly, one form per child.
- 4. Tags must be permanently attached to the goat ear.
- 5. If a project goat should die or have a severe health problem prior to June 7, 2021 the exhibitor may, with the approval of his/her project leader, replace this animal with another animal.
- 6. All goats must comply with the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines.
- 7. Upon arrival at the CMR Farm Fair, all goats must be checked by a Department Chairman at the time of unloading for signs of any contagious disease. Animals deemed unfit or unhealthy must be removed from the show grounds immediately. THE DECISION OF DEPARTMENT LEADERS IS FINAL.
- 8. Exhibitors must show their own entries unless the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class (or in group classes), or permission is given by the show superintendent. Substitute show persons must be eligible 4-H or FFA member.
- 9. Showmanship is mandatory! Participation in showmanship is required to be eligible to show in the Market Goat show or Dairy Goat show.
- 10. Market Goats may be wethers or does.
- 11. All males must be castrated and completely healed, showing NO evidence of testicular tissue.
- 12. All meat goats' horns must be tipped or may be dehorned. Dairy goats must be dehorned.
- 13. Entry fees are \$8 for non-sale, breeding animals and \$25 per sale kid. Fees are non-refundable. (\$25 sale animal fee includes buyer rosette, buyer recognition & buyer dinner) The Entry Deadline is June 5, 2021. All entries received after the deadline will be charged double the regular entry fee rate!
- 14. Exhibitors are restricted to **3 market kids** and a limit of **2 entries per class in the breeding shows**. Total goats exhibited **cannot exceed 10 per exhibitor**.
- 15. The Department Leaders may, at their discretion, split, combine or eliminate any class or classes based on the number of entries received. The decision of the Department Leaders is final.
- 16. Premiums are: 1<sup>st</sup>-\$6, 2<sup>nd</sup>-\$5, 3<sup>rd</sup>-\$4, 4<sup>th</sup>-\$3, 5<sup>th</sup>-\$2 and 6<sup>th</sup>-\$1 for meat and breeding classes.
- 17. All exhibitors are **required** to show in their appropriate showmanship class. Premiums for showmanship are: 1<sup>st</sup>-\$12, 2<sup>nd</sup>-\$10, 3<sup>rd</sup>-\$8, 4<sup>th</sup>-\$6, 5<sup>th</sup>- \$4 and 6<sup>th</sup>-\$4. Only participation ribbons, no premiums, will be given to youth ages 5-8 in the Cloverbud division.
- 18. Completed record books need to be turned in to the Extension Office by September 30th.
- 19. All goat pens are to be provided and setup by the exhibitor/family in areas pre-designated by the Goat Department Chairmen. Pens shall not be larger than 5x5 (pen space assigned is determined by # of entries)
- 20. Dairy goat exhibitors are encouraged to wear Dairy Whites, however Khaki trousers with a white polo or white button up shirt are acceptable with closed toe shoes or boots and matching belt. Tank tops, halter tops and clogs are not acceptable.
- 21. Meat goat exhibitors will wear short or long sleeve dress shirts, trousers and closed toe shoes or boots with matching belt. Tank tops, halter tops, and clogs are not acceptable.
- 22. All market kids will be weighed and divided into classes by weight, with a minimum weight of 30 lbs. and a maximum weight of 140 lbs. Exhibitors are encouraged to present their market kids in the 70-80 pound weight range.
- 23. Doe kids may be shown in the age appropriate class in the market section **OR** the breeding section, **not both**. Wethers and doe kids will be co-exhibited in the market classes. Wethers cannot be shown in breeding classes. Dairy wethers are NOT permitted on the grounds unless showing in the market classes and will be eligible for sale.
- 24. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion market animals are required to be sold. The sale of other market goats at the CMR Farm Fair is optional.
- 25. Only goats being shown in classes at the CMR Fair will be allowed on the fairgrounds.
- 26. THE DECISION OF DEPARTMENT LEADERS IS FINAL.
