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PROPERTY MAINTENANCE INSPECTIONS

Every spring, the PCA requests that residents take a look at the appearance of their properties and make any necessary repairs, tend to yard maintenance, and remove improperly stored items from the property. **Inspections are scheduled to start on July 22.**

Examples of common maintenance problems are:

- Overgrown grass, bushes, or trees
- Loose or missing shutters, siding, or siding trim
- Gutters filled with vegetation or not properly attached to the house
- Peeling paint on house trim parts
- Rusty, damaged, or leaning mail boxes
- Mold or dirt on siding
- Damaged or leaning fences;
- Personal items stored in yard where they are visible from street (tools, auto parts, gardening supplies, trash cans, etc.)
- Car ports cluttered with excessive storage
- Vehicles/trailers/RVs in an obvious state of disrepair or parked on grass

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Please understand that maintaining the appearance of the community is a primary responsibility of a homeowner's association. The PCA's purpose is not to be critical or punitive, but simply to encourage residents to complete needed maintenance, and to keep the community looking attractive and welcoming.

If you receive a maintenance violation letter, it will clearly describe the problem, explain what is required to clear the violation, and will provide a deadline. **Please contact the PCA if you need more time to complete the project.**

NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY

Warm weather is the perfect time for children to get outside and enjoy active playtime with friends. While it is safest to have children play in the yard, some games may require a harder surface, which leads to children playing on the neighborhood roads.

Please, keep in mind that the vehicle traffic is the primary purpose of the roadways. With street parking that can obstruct drivers' views and the increase of distracted driving, the street is not the safest place for children to play. "Children at Play" signs often give children and parents a false sense of security.

"Unintentional pedestrian injuries are the fifth leading cause of injury-related death in the United States for children ages 5 to 19." –safekids.org

This is just a reminder to help keep your children and drivers safe by supervising or eliminating playing in the street.

RESPECT FOR COMMON GROUNDS

We all share our neighborhood and our parks, so we all have an interest in keeping these areas clean and safe. The PCA has noticed an increase in the amount of trash being dropped in Club View Park and in some townhouse areas. We also have had the tennis court gate pried and kicked open a few times and reports of young people sitting on the nets.

2019 Assessment News

Status of Annual Assessment: The 2019 HOA assessment payment was due on January 31. As of May 31, we still had 79 properties whose owners had not paid the assessment. We will continue to pursue payment from these owners and will file property liens or law suits as necessary.

Payment Methods: This year, the PCA has a new website, and it offers online payment of the annual assessment. We offer payment buttons for the current year's townhouse and detached house assessments. To pay for past years or to pay a different amount, please send the PCA an e-mail. We will e-mail you a link to a customized invoice, which will allow you to select your payment amount. Online payments incur a 2.9% processing fee, all of which goes to our payment processor.

As always, the PCA offers payment plans. You can pay using two or three monthly installments or sign an extended payment plan.

<u>REFURBISHED TENNIS COURTS</u> <u>ARE OPEN</u>

Last fall, the PCA started the project of refurbishing the two tennis courts in Club View Park. Weather delays pushed the project into this spring, but the work is finally complete. The courts are open for play, and we will soon have signs posted on the court to display the rules for court usage.

Court Usage: The Board of Directors has decided that the courts will be open for use by PCA residents only. We will monitor the amount of use the courts get, and we can later revisit the decision about who can use the courts. Note that our neighbors in Plantations Two have also recently completed a refurbishment of their courts. To gain access to their courts they are charging non-residents a one-time \$100 fee and a \$50 deposit.

<u>Registering to Use Tennis Courts:</u> All residents of PCA properties can use our courts in Club View Park, but users must first register with the PCA to obtain the gate access code. Please check the PCA website for the court use application form, or contact the PCA by phone or by e-mail.

Pickleball: The tennis court nearest the gate has also been lined for pickleball. This is a sport that uses a smaller court, racquets that resemble large ping pong paddles, and a plastic ball. The USA Pickleball Association says that pickleball is "a paddle sport created for all ages and skill levels". Learn more here: https://www.usapa.org/what-is-pickleball.

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Summary of Court Rules:

- The courts are for use by registered users and their guests.
- The courts are to be used for tennis and pickleball only. No bicycles, skateboards, scooters, pets, or other sports are allowed.
- Soft-soled shoes such as sneakers are required. It is recommended that a court type of shoe be worn, as the wedge-shaped soles on running shoes may cause injury during side to side movement.
- Players shall relinquish the court after an hour when other players are waiting.
- The courts are closed from sunset to sunrise.
- No glass containers, food, or alcohol are allowed on the court.
- Please remove your trash when leaving the court.
- Please keep the gate closed and locked at all times.

Please note that the PCA can deny/rescind court access to residents whose accounts are not current, or who have broken community rules.



BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR – NOISE PROBLEMS

This is the time of year when outdoor entertaining is popular, and that can lead to noise problems. Please be considerate of your neighbors, and lower the sounds of music and voices as the hours get late.

Montgomery County has a "quiet time" law that requires lowered sound levels between certain hours, listed as 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. weekdays and 9 p.m. to 9 a.m. on weekends and holidays.

MANAGING YOUR PETS

Over the past few months, the PCA has heard of a number of incidents where residents have not properly controlled their pets. In one case, a dog ran out to bite someone who was walking in the street; and in another case dogs were being let loose to defecate in other residents' yards.

Please respect your neighbors and your community and be a responsible pet owner. Dogs should not be allowed off your property except while on a leash. By County law, all dog feces deposited off your own property must be immediately picked up.

Please also note that dog feces contain dangerous bacteria that can enter our waterways when storm water washes the bacteria out of our yards. The sooner feces are picked up, the better. You can find more information here:
