









RICHARD RAFFAN

In 1978 Richard came to Australia for three months to work as a Craftsman in Residence at Sturt Workshops in Mittagong, just south of Sydney. He returned there in 1982 when he emigrated to Australia. Starting over in a new environment is challenging, but he soon found four galleries that kept him fully occupied. In 1983-4 he served on the Australian Crafts Council Selection Panel.

In woodturning circles today Richard Raffan is best known as a writer and teacher, for his books, videos, and magazine articles, as well as for demonstrations and hands-on workshops.
