Subject: Oyster Bay Oval masterplan - stakeholder consultation

Hi Diarmuid,

Thank you for your invitation to the session to provide an update on the Oyster Bay Oval Masterplan Design. We understand and support in principle the Council's desire to upgrade the oval and surrounding area.

We were however very disappointed that the latest plan makes no reference by name or inference to our club which in turn does nothing to give us any certainty about our future at the current location, or indeed our ability to continue to provide a service to the community. None of our concerns that were expressed in our submission last year have been addressed or discussed. (For ease of reference our submission has been reproduced below). The building in scenario's 2 & 3 are still referred to as multipurpose use which, as outlined in our previous submission, would not work from a health and safety position.

We suggest that a possible solution could be the construction of a 2-level building. Our Club would occupy the ground floor which would enable our equipment to be securely and safely locked away. The first floor, with external access and shared facilities would then be available to the general public as a multipurpose facility.

Diarmuid, while we fully understand that this project is to improve the current sporting facilities at Oyster Bay Oval, we hope that Council can understand the concern our club and it's 120 odd financial members has for its future under the existing draft plans, and would welcome the opportunity to meet with yourself and other interested parties to try and come up with an amicable solution for all concerned. The Club is seeking direction from the Council as to what our future accommodation will be.

PARKING

No parking was indicated in the plan directly in front of the proposed building. Club members would have to compete with the general public and oval users for the car places along Como Road. They might find

themselves parking 200/300m from the clubhouse if they are lucky to get a park at all. Most of our members are in their seventies, eighties and nineties and always bring with them their tools and items they are working on. These items can be heavy and may require more than one trip. The proposed removal of a number of existing trees would create the space for off street parking for the members.

Original submission - Oyster Bay Oval masterplan

COUNCIL SUBMISSION – OYSTER BAY OVAL MASTERPLAN CUBBY HOUSE TURNERS AND WOODIES INC

The Cubby House Turners and Woodies Inc (the club) have occupied the premises known as 88A Como Road Oyster Bay since 1996. The club's location forms part of the Oyster Bay Oval. The club provides the following:

- 1. Gives the opportunity for any member of the general public (both men and women) to learn the art and skills of woodturning/woodworking
- 2. Support the ageing generation (particularly those in retirement) through friendship and caring for their mental health
- 3. Support local charities each year by making in excess of 600 toys for the less fortunate families in the area. All members have the opportunity to assist with making the toys

The club needs to be part of the proposed masterplan for the Oval as we provide support for the community as outlined above. We note that the masterplan has provision for a multi-purpose clubhouse and community building. To enable us to produce those toys we require a wide range of wood working machinery which from a safety point of view could not be accommodated in a shared facility. This machinery is in turn connected to a dedicated dust extraction/collection system for the health and safety of our members and the community. This is a big safety issue and essential in any building we occupy.

The existing building/location has its shortcomings and we outline the following:

ACCESS AND LOCATION

Entry to and exit from the property has always had a real element of danger. The entry/exit is positioned just short of a bend in Como Road at the same time as descending down a hill. Cars coming in the opposite direction are unsighted due to bushland near the bend in Como Road which leaves little time when trying to enter the club property. The danger could be reduced by either:

- 1. **Existing club premises -** Moving the entry/exit further down Como Road (away from the bend) but would take part of the existing parkland or
- 2. New building Build new premises next to the car park at the opposite end of the parkland

PARKING

There is no defined off-street parking, just the space in front of the club house where you also have to dodge trees that also occupy the area. Parking would be increased if the area had a tar surface with marked parking spaces and proper drainage (See also Access and Location). The removal of some trees would be required.

We currently have 102 financial members, 18 of whom joined in the last 2 years, showing the increasing demand in the community for a facility such as ours. Our needs for now and in the future would ideally include:

- 1. A larger building, either new build or extension and upgrade of existing building. We have outgrown the existing building and are currently using a 20ft shipping container for storage. At present we only have space for one work bench where additional work benches would allow improved productivity and increase our ability to generate a greater number of toys each year. We have estimated that if a new building were to be erected it would need to have a minimum floor space of approximately 500 square meters.
- 2. Outdoor Space The club currently has an outdoor covered area at the front of the building. This area or a similar covered open-air area is required and utilised for painting the toys and working on larger projects.
- 3. A combined kitchen / coffee area of approximately 30 m2
- 4. A toilet block comprising 1 1800mm urinal 2-male p.c.'s 2 Female p.c.'s and 1-Disabled Unisex Toilet.
- 5. A combined Library / Meeting room of approximately 30 m2
- 6. A room approx 16 square metres dedicated to dust creating machinery including linishers, disc and spindle sanders etc. to reduce the amount of dust permeating the rest of the workshop area
- 7. We introduced opening on Tuesday nights to accommodate the needs of working age members. Opening at night gives them the opportunity to use the club's equipment. Under consideration at the moment is to open a second night

The Cubby House Turners and Woodies Inc agrees with the Council's efforts to upgrade the Oyster Bay Oval area and the club wants to be included in any enhancements.

In backing our submission Psychologist, Dr Mike Martin has written (see attached) in support of the benefits the club provided to members.









