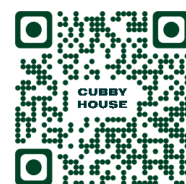

Until next time continue to enjoy your woodturning and/or woodworking.

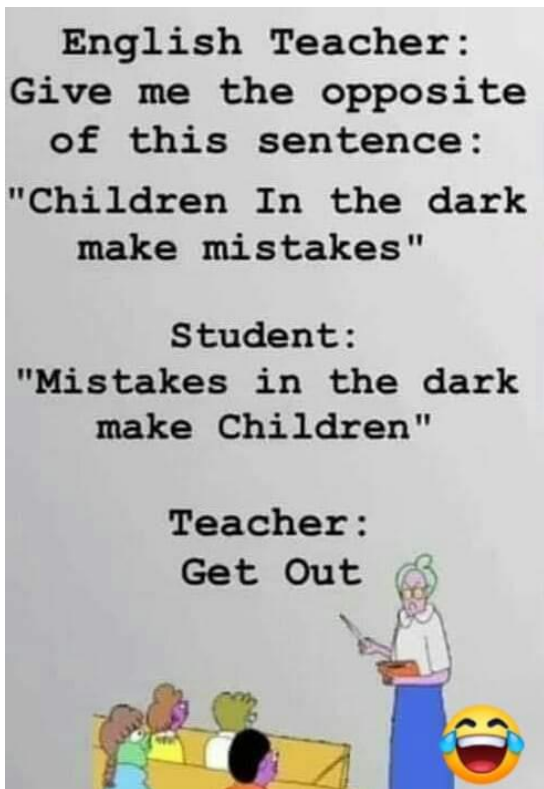

## 7. General Business

- At the August Committee meeting a request was made to present a motion to the 2023 AGM to increase the number of Ordinary Committee Members from the current three to twenty-two

which is equal to the number of the unofficial positions that the club has created. This request and motion have been withdrawn

- We have been endeavouring to organise an information session on the use of resin. Phil Dean will continue to follow up and will let you know of any progress
- There is no further information with regards to the Sutherland Shire Councils proposed redesign for the Oyster Bay Oval which includes the clubhouse. Any updates will be communicated through the Newsletter or a separate email. This matter will be followed up by Phil Dean
- Carbatec have advised they are discontinuing the discount to individuals but not clubs. If any members want to obtain the Carbatec discount they will need to place an order through the Cubby House. The ordering procedures the club needs to put in place have not yet been discussed by the committee. We will provide further details after the Committee Meeting
- The next Bunnings BBQ will be held on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2023. We would appreciate as many members as possible to come along and help out even for an hour or two
- Toy week – Monday 28/8 to Friday 1/9/2023. These weeks are required to speed up the making of the toys we donate the charities in November each year. Any help even for a couple of hours would be greatly appreciated
- Toy sale weekend – 4/5 November 2023. This is held in the area in front of the clubhouse. Again, is the request for members to assist even for a couple of hours

These fundraising events are for the benefit and viability of the club and it is the responsibility for all members to help out whenever possible

- Cook Community Classic. We have 60 books with 10 tickets per book. The tickets are \$2 each. If all tickets are sold the club would receive \$1,200. We have over 70 financial members but if say 30 members sold two books the job is done. This event happens every year so please take a couple of books from Keith Jones
- Training – It was agreed at the August Committee meeting to charge or reintroduce a training fee of \$100 to apply from the date of the AGM ie 19/8/2023. The fee does not apply to members who have already joined but have not started or finished the course
- The club has cloth backed sandpaper – \$7 per mitre and slimline pen kits – \$4 each for sale to members

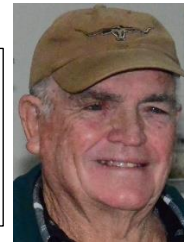

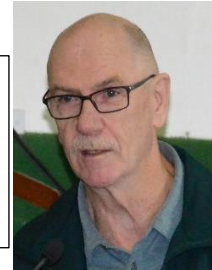
