through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,  
who is alive and reigns with you,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, now and for ever.

### Old Testament Reading Psalm 112. 1-9 (10) OT Pg: 592

Alleluia. Blessed are those who fear the Lord  
and have great delight in his commandments.  
Their descendants will be mighty in the land,  
a generation of the faithful that will be blest.  
Wealth and riches will be in their house,  
and their righteousness endures for ever.  
Light shines in the darkness for the upright;  
gracious and full of compassion are the righteous.  
It goes well with those who are generous in lending  
and order their affairs with justice,  
For they will never be shaken;  
the righteous will be held in everlasting remembrance.  
They will not be afraid of any evil tidings;  
their heart is steadfast, trusting in the Lord.  
Their heart is sustained and will not fear,  
until they see the downfall of their foes.  
They have given freely to the poor;  
their righteousness stands fast for ever;  
their head will be exalted with honour.

### New Testament Reading Matthew 5. 13-20 NT Pg: 4

Jesus said: "You are the salt of the earth. But if the  
salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty  
again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be  
thrown out and trampled by men.  
"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill  
cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and  
put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand,  
and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the  
same way, let your light shine before men, that they  
may see your good deeds and praise your Father in  
heaven.

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or  
the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to  
fulfil them. I tell you the truth, until heaven and  
earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least  
stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from  
the Law until everything is accomplished. Anyone  
who breaks one of the least of these commandments  
and teaches others to do the same will be called least  
in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practises and  
teaches these commands will be called great in the  
kingdom of heaven. For I tell you that unless your  
righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the  
teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the  
kingdom of heaven."
