



With no second thoughts or doubts, about becoming a dietician, she really enjoys her job. She likes working with children because she likes teaching about diet and because they have such open minds.



Our cooking class made these treats for everyone:

OATMEAL FREEZER COOKIES

Flour, unsifted	1 1/2 cups	Makes ~ 6 dozen 50 Calories per cookie
Baking Powder	1 tsp.	
Salt	1 tsp.	
Allspice	1 tsp. (we used cinnamon)	
Margarine	1 cup	
Sugar	3/4 cup	
Sweet Magic	18 packets	
Eggs	2	
Vanilla	1 tsp.	
Rolled Oats	3 cups	
Raisins, chopped	1 cup	

1. Mix dry ingredients; except sugar.
2. Mix marg., sugar + Sweet Magic until creamy. Add eggs and vanilla. Mix well.
3. Stir in dry ingredients. Add rolled oats and raisins.
4. Divide into 4 equal parts. Shape dough into a roll about 6 inches long and 1 1/2 inches in diameter. Wrap in waxed paper and freeze.


To Bake:

5. Preheat oven to 350° F grease baking sheet.
6. Remove a roll of dough from freezer. Remove wrap.
7. Slice about 1/4 inch thick. Place on baking sheet.
8. Bake about 15 minutes or until lightly brown.





Even when dtheir not that good.


