BLOOD TESTING

Blood testing is something every diabetic does at Clara Barton Camp. All campers rise and shine in the morning to go do a blood in the lab. It is thought that blood tests are better because it tells you more than a urine test. All campers have to do a blood test four times a day. Blood should be tested before you treat for reaction or if you feel very high. In our lab, a urine test for ketones is done if a blood chemstrip reads 240 or more. There are some things around that are new for blood testing. Autolets make it easier, quicker, and less painful to prick a finger with a lancet. Glucometers give accurate, fast readouts of sugar levels.


Bran Cereal Blueberry Muffins

Whole bran cereal	1 cup
milk	1 cup
Egg	1
Oil	1/4 cup
Honey	1/4 cup
Whole Wheat Flour	1 1/4 cups
Baking Powder	2 tsp.
Baking Soda	1/4 tsp
Salt	1/2 tsp
Blueberries	handful

1. Preheat oven to 400°F
2. Grease muffin tins
3. Stir bran cereal and milk together in a bowl.
4. Add egg, oil and honey. Beat well.
5. Stir remaining ingredients together until well mixed. Add to liquid mixture and stir only until mixed.
6. Put into muffin tins
7. Bake about 20-25 minutes or until lightly browned.

Makes 12 medium muffins.
About 140 calories each.
