





Half Moon Bay

Make Half Moon Bay your first stop when you leave San Francisco. Enjoy everything from its historic main street and cute shops to miles of beaches and many trails for hiking, biking, and bird watching. Half Moon Bay is also just a half-hour north of Año Nuevo State Park, a destination full of remote beaches perfect for spotting elephant seals. visithalfmoonbay.org



Monterey Bay Aquarium

Located right on the coast, Monterey Bay Aguarium is almost two hours down the coast from Half Moon Bay. This renowned nonprofit organization hosts over 200 exhibits and 80,000 animals and plants. Check out one of their newest exhibits, "Into the Deep," and see glowing jellyfish, fanged fish, and octopuses.



Bixby Bridge

Take your turn photographing one of the most famously picture-worthy spots on the West Coast. Thirty minutes south of Monterey, this bridge is one of the tallest single-span arch bridges in the entire world. While you'll notice it's much narrower than modern bridges (it's only 24 feet wide!), never fear, you can still drive your RV across.

What are your top resources for planning a road trip?

In 2019 I took my first big roadtrip across America sleeping in my Nissan Altima. This trip inspired me to live life on a perpetual roadtrip in my self converted camper van from then on. While a lot of people enjoy a spontaneous trip going wherever the road takes them, I personally enjoy a trip most when I have things planned in advance. There are so many resources I have come to live by when preparing for the perfect road trip.


I start on Roadtrippers.com and place my start and end destinations on their map. Then I use websites such as AtlasObscura, OnlyInYourState, and Pinterest to plan where I want to stop along the route. On the final days before I head out on the road I use the road trip vehicle preparation checklist in **Project VanLife's free Maintenance E-Book** to make sure my van is in the best condition possible!

I also always have apps like Campspot on my phone to help me find places to sleep in my van at night and apps like GasBuddy to help me find the gas station with the cheapest prices near my current location. As a solo female traveler, I take my safety very seriously and use apps like bSafe and Parachute to give myself an extra layer of protection when traveling. And of course my favorite app to have for a road trip is Spotify because there is no feeling like driving the open road with the windows down and vibing to the perfect road trip playlist.

Stargaze in Dark Sky Preserves

Six of Michigan's state parks are home to dark sky preserves and are incredible areas for stargazing. Michigan also has three internationally designated dark sky parks. Did you know you can see the northern lights from Michigan? They're best experienced from August to April, so be sure to try and catch a glimpse if you're visiting in the fall. michigan.gov

Explore Isle Royale National Park

Located in the wayyyy northwestern bit of Michigan, summer and early fall are the best times to visit this national park, as the island is closed between November 1 and April 15. Whether you're a hiker, boater, or looking for some good ol' family fun on the water, this slice of paradise has it all. Divers can even explore the most intact shipwreck collection in the national park service! It is a remote location, though, so plan accordingly.

Hunt for Morel Mushrooms

Safely practiced mushroom foraging can be a great family activity that encourages exercise and exploration! Michigan is home to thousands of wild mushrooms, but hunting for the morel is perfect for beginners because of its easier identification. Visit michigan.gov to read up on tips for getting started, and to find helpful maps.

Take a Tour of Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore

Fear not, you won't accidentally disturb actual slumbering bears while on a jaunt down this national lakeshore. You will see a giant dune that looks like a sleeping bear though! This renowned part of Michigan is home to miles and miles of sandy beaches. Come for the spectacular dunes, coastal villages, and relaxing walks, but stay for the bird-watching, lighthouses, shopping, and museums! sleepingbeardunes.com

What are the best Michigan beaches to visit in the summer?

Michigan, the "Great Lake State," is hugged by four of the Great Lakes and home to more than 11,000 inland lakes; which means you're never more than six miles from a body of water and your next beach destination.

Visiting Lake Michigan and Lake Huron means finding golden sand beaches, rock hunting, lighthouses, and freshwater. On Lake Michigan, popular beaches include Grand Haven, Ludington, Frankfort, Silver Lake, St. Joseph, and the spectacular Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore. The sunrise side of the state, Lake Huron, holds many of Michiganders' favorite beaches including Lexington, Port Austin, Tawas City, Alpena, and Cheboygan.

Heading inland, Lake St. Claire, Torch Lake, Houghton Lake, Gun Lake, Walloon Lake, Hamlin Lake, and Glen Lake are just a few of the best lake beaches to hit this summer for their smaller crowds. good fishing, and time in the sun.





Ask an Expert

What's the best way to safely view an eclipse?

Viewing the eclipse requires eye protection for all phases—except during totality for those who are in the path when it is safe to view the sun with your naked eye. So, it is important that safe solar glasses are used to watch the eclipse. Vendors for those glasses are listed on the American Astronomical Society special eclipse website, eclipse.aas.org, and are also available through Galileoscope at galileoscope.org/eclipse.


Similarly, there are filters and other accessories that can make the eclipse safely viewable through binoculars or telescopes. Those accessories are available from a wide range of telescope and astronomy vendors. If you engage amateur or professional astronomy groups, they will no doubt have the right equipment for watching the eclipse.

Both of the upcoming eclipses—the annular eclipse in October of '23 and the total eclipse in April '24 will be livestreamed by The Exploratorium, with support from NASA. Those live streams are a fun way to watch these eclipses move across the country, and also provide the opportunity to watch the eclipse even if the weather isn't accommodating where you are on eclipse day!

Hike the "Land of the Waterfalls"

Transylvania County in western North Carolina boasts an astronomical number of waterfalls (over 250!) in its vicinity. This includes Whitewater Falls, one of the tallest waterfalls in the eastern part of the United States. Grab a guide book or your favorite hiking app and create your own waterfall bucket list. Just don't forget snacks! transylvaniacounty.org

Zipline Through Blowing Rock

A popular destination in the Blue Ridge Mountains, Blowing Rock is a great place to take the family ziplining as several companies offer lines and excursions in the general area. Some even offer cliff jumping! Sail through the trees, walk over wobbly bridges in midair, and try to keep your eyes open so you don't miss anything North Carolina has to offer blowingrock.com

Drive the Blue Ridge Parkway

A 469-mile road that meanders through North Carolina and Virginia, "America's favorite drive" offers a great way to witness North Carolina's beautiful fall foliage. It starts in North Carolina near the Great Smoky Mountains National Park and passes right by Cherokee, Asheville, and Blowing Rock, providing much to experience along the drive. From the Folk Art Center at mile 382 to the Biltmore Estate in Asheville, this scenic parkway has something for everyone. blueridgeparkway.org

Reach New Heights in Statesville

Known as the "Hot Air Balloon Capital of the East," and an established ballooning center since the 1960s, Statesville provides hot air balloon rides with views of Pilot Mountain, Charlotte, and Winston Salem. Park your RV at a nearby campground, grab the most daring in your party, and gain a new perspective on your surroundings that you'll never forget. lostinthecarolinas.com



Located only about 25 miles east of Asheville, Old Fort is a small town surrounded by Pisgah National Forest, making it a dream hiking destination. It's easy to access and also known for its pre-Revolutionary War history and proximity to waterfall trails. Yes, please! romanticasheville.com

Ask an Expert

What are some of the best hiking trails in North Carolina?

North Carolina boasts some of the most amazing views of waterfalls, rainforests, and mountaintops accessible by foot/boat. Want to walk behind a waterfall? I recommend the rated easy yet stunning 1.5-mile roundtrip hike to Moore Cove Falls in Brevard.

Prefer to take it up a notch and see mountains for days? Check out western North Carolina's Looking Glass Rock trail, a 6.2-mile roundtrip hike that will take you to the top of the world and have you feeling like a rockstar at the end! Also, the Mountains-to-Sea Trail is a 1,200-mile trail that spans the whole state with access points every few miles. This trail is versatile from the mountains to the coast where you'll see wildlife and wildflowers, and you'll even get to paddle some of the sections like on the Neuse River.

What are your campers' favorite amenities?



Easy Camping Breakfast Burritos

BY CARLIN FRIMMEL

Serves 2

Equipment needed: Large frying pan, spatula, tongs, cheese grater (or pre-shredded cheese)



INGREDIENTS

4 to 6 eggs, beaten

½ onion, diced

1 jalapeno, diced (remove seeds if you don't like it too spicy)

½ green bell pepper, diced

2 handfuls fresh spinach

1 avocado, sliced

½ cup shredded cheese of choice

4 to 6 slices bacon

2 to 4 medium/large tortillas

Sriracha or salsa (optional)

MAKEIT

Cook bacon on medium-low heat until crispy. Remove from the skillet and cover until ready to assemble the wrap. Drain excess bacon fat.

Add 1 tablespoon of olive oil to the skillet. Sauté onions, jalapeño, and green bell peppers until softened, about five minutes.


Add fresh spinach and sauté for a couple minutes until softened (optional). Alternatively, you can add the fresh spinach into the burrito at the end if you prefer. Add eggs and cook until scrambled, about 5 to 8 minutes. Add shredded cheese at the end and cook until melted. Turn off the heat.

Assemble the burritos by adding a spoonful of the scrambled egg/vegetable mixture, a couple slices of cooked bacon, some avocado slices, and desired sauces to the tortilla. Wrap tightly and enjoy!


