



“LETTER OF ENCOURAGEMENT”

1 Peter 2:21-24 (NKJV)

²¹ For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for ^[e]us, leaving ^[f]us an example, that you should follow His steps: ²² “Who committed no sin, Nor was deceit found in His mouth”; ²³ who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed *Himself* to Him who judges righteously; ²⁴ who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose ^[g]stripes you were healed.

We Were Called to This!

Today we commemorate the crucifixion of our Savior Jesus Christ on Mount Calvary. He suffered physically for the sins of all mankind. He suffered painfully for our transgressions. He suffered in the flesh for the weakness of our flesh. Through it all, He never said a mumbling word.
