

GDPR Compliance Privacy Policy

Revised: January 19 2019

We at NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM (“NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM”, “we”, “us” of “our”) know you care about how your personal information is used and shared—and we take your privacy seriously. We have prepared this Privacy Policy to explain how we collect, use, protect, and disclose information and data when you use the NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM website (“Site”) and any NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM mobile application and other services offered by NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM, including when you make a donation to NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM, whether through the Site or otherwise (collectively, the “Services”). This Privacy Policy also explains your choices for managing your information preferences, including opting out of certain uses of your Personal Information (defined below). This Privacy Policy applies to all users of the Site and Services. The Site and Services are provided by NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN’S PRISON REFORM.

BY USING THE SITE OR SERVICES, YOU ARE CONSENTING TO THIS PRIVACY POLICY. PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY.

What is Personal Data?

Personal data is defined by the General Data Protection Regulation (Regulation 2019/679) (the “GDPR”) as ‘any information relating to an identifiable persona who can be directly or indirectly identified in particular by reference to an identifier’. Personal data is, in simpler terms, any information about you that enables you to be identified. Personal data covers obvious information such as your name and contact details, but also covers less obvious information such as identification numbers, electronic location data and other online identifiers such as pictures.

Managing Your Information Preferences

You can review, correct, update, or change your Personal Information or opt out of receiving certain emails by changing the relevant settings in your account or by e-mailing

us a (put your mail here) . You are able to opt out of receiving marketing and donation solicitation e-mails from us, however, you cannot opt out of receiving all e-mails from us, such as e-mails about the status of your account of donation. If you sign-up to receive text messages from us, you may opt out of receiving such messages in the future by following the instructions provided in each text. If you have questions of concerns regarding this Privacy Policy, please e-mail us at the same address.

What are my rights?

Under the GDPR, you have the following rights, which we will always work to uphold.

The right to be informed about our collection and use of your personal data. This Privacy Notice should tell you everything you need to know, but you can always contact us to find out more of to ask any questions using the details.

The right to access the personal data we hold about you.

The right to have your personal data rectified if any of your personal data held by us is inaccurate or incomplete. Please contact us using the details.

The right to be forgotten, ie, the right to ask us to delete or otherwise dispose of any of your personal data that we have.

The right to restrict (ie, prevent) the processing of your personal data.

The right to object to us using your personal data for a particular purpose or purposes.

The right to data portability. This means that, if you have provided personal data to us directly, we are using it with consent of for the performance of a contract, and that data is processed using automated means, you can ask us for a copy of that personal data to re-use with another service or business in many cases.

How do we use your personal data?

Under the GDPR, we must always have a lawful basis for using personal data. This may be because the data is necessary for our performance of a contract with you, because you have consented to our use of your personal data, or because it is in our legitimate organisation interest to use it. Collection of Personal Information

National Association of Women's Prison Reform collects and protects personal information from these categories of individuals:

- **Visitors:** those who visit or use our site or any of our services, so that we can meet their needs by providing them with the site services they require;
- **Workers:** all our staffs working directly or indirectly with us so as to know their background as well as health status
- **Job seekers:** those that apply for job vacancies to fill our internal positions or as part of our staffing and recruiting services;
- **Clients, sellers, service providers, and other suppliers:** employees, representatives and/or customer agents, service providers, sellers, or other suppliers with whom we have a business relationship with or supervise on our clients' behalf;
- **Referees and others:** whose advice is on the satisfactory position given to job seekers.

If you submit any personal information of other people to us or to our service providers in connection with the National Association of Women's Prison Reform, you confirm that you have the rights to do so and to permit us to use the information in accordance with this policy.

Types of information we collect:

- **Information submitted to us:** National Association of Women's Prison Reform collects personal information that individuals provide to us through our services. These are collected when they visit our sites, post on our forums or blogs, sign up for an account to access specific National Association of Women's Prison Reform services, or when they subscribe to our marketing services, register for an event or webinar, or otherwise contact us. We may also collect personal information from individual offline, e.g. when individuals provide information to us through phone call or text message or in person, at events or at one of our recruitment offices.

Types of personal information collected:

- contact information (but not limited to): name, postal address, email address, and telephone number
- username and password on registering on our sites
- professional information (but not limited to): job title, department, or job post
- information you provide about others whom you would like us to contact (like, referrals or references) or information regarding your emergency contacts

- résumé/C.V. information (but not limited to): employment and education history, language proficiencies, security clearance information, and other work-related skills, awards/honors, certification, membership in clubs and organisations, hobbies and information regarding your career interests and other qualifications for, or desires regarding future employment opportunities, including information regarding desired compensation and benefits
- citizenship ; and
- work authorization status.

You will be notified of all information requested from you. Before collection, you will be informed of the personal information being requested whether required by employers as a term of their employment or by law, or needed on a voluntary basis, and the consequences of denying such information.

- **Information we collect automatically:** From visitors to our site, we automatically collect certain technical information (but not limited to): Internet protocol (IP) address of their device, login information, device type and unique identification numbers, browser type and version, time zone setting, browser plug-in types and versions, operating system and platforms. Information about their visits to our site, such as download errors experienced and length of visits to certain pages. When you access the National Association of Women’s Prison Reform site, our service providers and we may track and collect certain device-related information (such as your type and device unique ID) to know what information you accessed based on your device ID.
- **Information collected from other sources or third parties:** We may request or acquire information about our visitors, job seekers, workers, customers, and suppliers from third-party partners (such as background check providers) or other third-party sources (such as information from publicly available sites (like Monster.com, CareerBuilder.com, or LinkedIn), or a job seeker’s third-party reference.
- You can also provide us with access to certain personal information stored by third parties, like social media sites. Take for instance, if you register for an account to access some of our sites (like the Communities site), you can choose to import your LinkedIn basic profile data (such as your name, experience, location, photo, and contact information). By authorizing the National Association of Women’s Prison Reform to have access to this information, in collecting, storing, and using this information,

following this privacy policy, National Association of Women's Prison Reform will only pursue the legitimate interests set out below under use of Personal Information.

- We also collect information that is available publicly from job boards or professional social media websites where career data is made available by individuals and can be viewed by recruiters.
- **Confidential Information:** Following the various services we provide, or if you are applying for a job opportunity with us or one of our customers, you may be asked for types of personal information that are viewed by some countries as confidential information. It includes, for instance, government-issued identification numbers (such as national insurance numbers, national identification number, etc.), information pertaining to a person's race or ethnic origin, political opinions or religious or philosophical beliefs, physical or mental health/condition, sexual orientation, trade union membership, genetic data and any related legal actions, or the processing of biometric data for the purposes of uniquely identifying an individual. It also includes information about an individual's criminal offences or convictions, as well as any other information deemed sensitive under applicable data protection laws (collectively "Confidential Personal Information").
- Despite the fact that we aim to reduce the amount of Confidential Personal Information that we process, such information may be processed in certain circumstances, such as where we are required to or permitted to do so by law (e.g. information about your racial/ethnic origin, gender, or affirmative action programmes) or where necessary, to provide you with a service, or if a criminal background check is required, drug/alcohol test or fitness-for-duty testing. If required by applicable data protection laws, we will obtain your express consent to our collection and use of your confidential personal information.

Use of Personal Information

The National Association of Women's Prison Reform will use the personal information collected only as specified in this policy and/or as we specify at the time of collection. Mostly, the personal information we collect and use is to practically provide and enhance the National Association of Women's Prison Reform services (such as staffing and recruiting service of our

site, workforce management or theft identification) and to observe applicable laws and government regulations (such as, to comply with mandatory employment, tax, and insurance requirements).

Expressly, your personal information may be used for the following purposes:

- Providing and administering the National Association of Women's Prison Reform services and for internal and external operations (e.g. handling all types of customer service problem, sales outsourcing, data analysis, improving business transactions between companies, handling personally identifiable information to detect and prevent theft, and improve security system);
- Protecting the National Association of Women's Prison Reform services (e.g. fraud monitoring, and prevention of hackers);
- Feedback to communications;
- Obeying laws and government regulations;
- Appointment setting;
- Promotion of products or services as needed;
- Calculating the number of users and usage of the site(s) to plan Site bandwidth, monitor traffic and capacity accordingly;
- Acknowledging you when you return as a repeat visitor to our Site(s)
- Providing information on requested goods and services;
- Providing you e-mails and other promotional communications about the National Association of Women's Prison Reform marketing, advertising, and promotions under your marketing preferences. You can opt-out of receiving e-mails at any time (see "Your Choices" below);
- For business purposes, such as improving transactions and increasing web marketing, originating new product and services;
- For fraud monitoring and prevention of hackers; and
- Informing you about changes to our services like, enhancing, improving or modifying our site, products and services; and operating and expanding our business activities.

Personal information collected online by the National Association of Women's Prison Reform service may also be complemented with information you provide to us through other services we render. As well as other online and offline sources (such as job fairs, social media platforms (on

facebook, twitter, LinkedIn), trade shows, or other events and other data appending methods (such as spot tags, tracking, and cookies as referenced below).

The personal information we receive may be used to create anonymised and aggregated statistics that do not reveal the specific identity of any person.

In most cases, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform will process personal information for a variety of business purposes which are in our legitimate interests (for instance, to operate its business and provide you with services you have requested), in order to enter into or perform a contract with you or for compliance with our legal obligations (as described above). However in some cases, and always where required by applicable law, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform will seek your consent to process your personal information (including any Confidential Personal Information).

Cookies and Online Tracking

A cookie is a small amount of data which is sent to your browser from a website; it is usually used to identify your device and serve you better through our website like ads. You can instruct your browser not to accept cookies or notify you when a cookie is sent to you. However, if you reject cookies, you may be denied access to some parts of our service.

The National Association of Women's Prison Reform uses "cookies" and similar technologies (e.g. web bugs, Google analytics) to help customize your online experience particularly the website you visit most and tracking website activities.

Analytic tools (like Google Analytics) is also used on some of our pages to set up intelligence events and better understand our customers and to take actions where needed. It is usually connected to websites through a tracking code used to track and report website traffic.

How does Google Analytics work?

Google Analytics uses a tracking code connected to our website through a javascript code found within our analytics account. Every user of our site will generate this code and then placed into the HTML back end of our site.

How can I opt out of being tracked by Google Analytics?

You can opt-out of both to prevent Google Analytics from storing data about your usage of our site and use of tracking cookies on other websites by following the opt-out link.

Sharing Your Personal Information within National Association of Women's Prison Reform

National Association of Women's Prison Reform may disclose your personal information to any affiliate within the company for use according to this privacy policy. These affiliates include our subsidiaries, affiliates, and our ultimate holding company.

The sharing of personal information with the National Association of Women's Prison Reform affiliates may include the combination of the personal information obtained by our company's sites. Information independently obtained on other National Association of Women's Prison Reform sites as well as data collected offline into one or more database(s) useable by the National Association of Women's Prison Reform, including all of its affiliates. Also, this combined information will only be used for the purposes stated within this privacy policy.

Third Party Access to Personal Information

In the following circumstances, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform may share and disclose personal information about you with the following types of third parties:

- **Potential employers or potential clients** – We may share your personal information if you are a job seeker with a client for the purpose of providing the National Association of Women's Prison Reform Services (such as staffing and recruiting services, or search, workforce management, or talent advisory services). As stated above, we may need to disclose specific information about your previous employment. Such as your C.V. and corresponding information permitted by law. The results of any criminal background checks or other specific employee data such SSN/National ID with that client or other service providers or agents acting on our behalf to facilitate and enable the potential placement or employment. Immediately you are employed by a client of the National Association of Women's Prison Reform through our search, workforce management, or outsourcing services, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform client will process such personal information in accordance with its own policies and procedures.
- **Compliance with laws** – We may disclose personal information to a third party where we are legally required to do so in order to respond to or comply with any applicable law, regulation, subpoenas, court orders, legal process, or government requests, including in response to public authorities to meet national security or law enforcement requirements.
- **Sellers, consultants, and other service providers** – We use third-party sellers, consultants, and other service providers to assist us in providing services, including to

support us in areas such as recruiting and reviewing responses to job advertisements, managing résumé/C.V. data, IT platform management or support services, infrastructure and application services, marketing, data analytics, skills and assessments training, occupational health and safety screening, and drug and background screening. In providing these services on behalf of the National Association of Women's Prison Reform. It may be necessary for us to grant these third parties access to your personal information. In the case of onward transfer of data of individuals residing in the EEA or Switzerland, third parties received under the EU-US Privacy Shield or the Swiss-US Privacy Shield. The National Association of Women's Prison Reform is potentially liable under the Privacy Shield Principles if our agents process your personal information in a manner inconsistent with the Principles unless we prove that we are not responsible for the event giving rise to the damage.

- **Business transfers** – Whether for strategic or other business reasons, as the case may be, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform decides to sell, buy, merge, or otherwise reorganize businesses. Such transaction may involve/in accordance with applicable law, the disclosure of personal information to prospective or actual buyers, or the receipt of it from sellers. It is the duty of the National Association of Women's Prison Reform to find appropriate protection for information in these types of transactions.
- **Fundamental interests and legal rights** – We may collect and share personal information and any other additional information available to us in order to investigate, prevent, or take action regarding illegal activities, suspected fraud, situations involving potential threats to the physical safety of any person, violations of the National Association of Women's Prison Reform terms of use, or as otherwise required by law, including without limitation to meet national security or law enforcement requirements. We may divulge your personal information to third parties while trying to establish or exercise a defend against our legal rights.

In agreement with you, we may divulge your personal information for other purposes as agreed.

Without your permission, we will never sell, rent or lease your personal information to any external company.

Legalized Basis for Organizing Personal Information (EEA users only)

Being a user from the European Economic Area (EEA), our legal basis for collecting and using the personal information described above will depend on the personal data concerned and the specific context in which we manage it.

Although, we usually collect personal information from you only (i) where your personal information is needed to initiate an agreement with you, (ii) where the processing is in our legitimate interests and not overridden by your rights, or (iii) where we have your permission to do so.

In some cases, we may legally be obliged to collect personal information from you. We might ask you to provide personal information to comply with a legal requirement or to perform a contract with you; we will make this clear at the relevant time and advise you whether the provision of your personal information is mandatory or not and also the possible effect if you do not provide your personal information.

If we gather and use your personal information on our legitimate interests dependency (or those of any third party), this interest will usually be to operate our platform and to communicate with you as necessary to provide our services to you and for our legitimate commercial interest. For instance, when responding to your queries, improving our services, undertaking marketing, or for the purposes of detecting or preventing illegal activities. We may have other legitimate interests and if appropriate we will make clear to you at the relevant time what those legitimate interests are.

You may decide to give your personal information to the National Association of Women's Prison Reform for a particular position for which you are not successful. In such situation, as you have indicated that you are looking for opportunities beyond your current role, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform may retain your personal information when there is a vacancy to present you with other opportunities for which your experience may be suitable. If you have concerns about the National Association of Women's Prison Reform retaining this data for these purposes, please give them your contact instead.

Global Data Transport

As an international company, we may send personal information to third parties located in the United States and in other countries that may be outside your country of residence, for storage

and processing to provide the National Association of Women's Prison Reform Services. These countries may not automatically have data protection laws as detailed as those in your state or residence. Also, we will have taken appropriate safeguards to protect your personal information under this policy and applicable law wherever it is processed. These safeguards include implementing the European Commission Standard Contractual Clauses for transfers of personal information between National Association of Women's Prison Reform and our self-certification to the Privacy Shield Frameworks which is explained in details below. More details on these safeguards can be provided upon request.

EU-US and Swiss-US Privacy Shield Framework

The personal information received from the EEA and Switzerland, National Association of Women's Prison Reform, LLC. and its US controlled subsidiary companies (for a full list of the US controlled subsidiary companies, click here) have certified their compliance to the EU-US and Swiss-US Privacy Shield Frameworks as set forth by the US Department of Commerce pertaining to the collection, use, and retention of personal information from the EEA and Switzerland sent to the United States in agreement to Privacy Shield. We have warranted that we adhere to the Privacy Shield Principles concerning such data. If there is any disagreement between the policies in this privacy policy and data subject rights under the Privacy Shield Principles, the Privacy Shield Principles shall dominate. The National Association of Women's Prison Reforms is subject to the investigatory and enforcement powers of the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) with regards to our compliance with the Privacy Shield.

EEA and Swiss individuals have the right to get our endorsement to ascertain if we protect personal information that relate to you. On request, we will provide you with access to the personal information that we hold about you. You may also correct, modify, or cancel the information we hold concerning you. An individual who requests for access to rectify, change, or delete inaccurate data, should complete the following web form here. If you experience any issues with the web form or you prefer to submit your requests to us outside of the preferred method of submission, please contact us. If asked to delete data, we sure would as soon as possible.

Your right to acquire your data may be limited in exceptional circumstances, including (but not limited to), when the burden or expense of providing this access would be disproportionate to the risks of your privacy as the case may be, or when the provision of such access would infringe the rights of persons other than you. If we determine that your access should be limited in a particular instance, we will provide you with an explanation of our determination and respond to any inquiries you may have.

We will provide an individual opt-out/opt-in choice before we share their data with third parties (other than our agents), or before we use it for a purpose (other than which it was originally collected or subsequently authorized). To reduce the use and disclosure of your personal information, please complete the following very brief web form here. If you experience any issues with the web form or you prefer to submit your requests to us outside of the preferred method of submission, please contact us.

You will receive e-mails to the e-mail address you provide through the web form acknowledging your request and updating you on the status of your request. All communications through this web portal are secure and encrypted. We encourage and appreciate your use of this process as it allows us to track requests in a centralized, safe and efficient system.

To protect your privacy and security, we may take steps to verify your identity. A password and user ID is needed if there is an account associated with your request, or identifying information such as your address or date of birth, before proceeding with your application.

In consent with the Privacy Shield Principles, the National Association of Women's Prison Reform commits to resolve complaints about your privacy and our collection or use of your personal information transferred to the United States under Privacy Shield. Residents of the EEA or Switzerland who believe that their information has not been processed in compliance with the Privacy Shield Principles may raise their complaints in some ways:

Your Privacy Rights

This is a right that enables an individual to make specific requests to an organization as pertaining to the processing of their personal data. These rights are implemented by data protection laws that differ from place to place. In the European Economic Area, your privacy rights include the following (but not limited to):

- (i) To request access to a copy of your personal information;
- (ii) To request rectification or erasure of data held about you;
- (iii) To restrict the processing of your personal information;
- (iv) For data portability;
- (v) Asides, you may also have the right to object to the processing of your personal information.

If we have gathered and processed your personal information with your agreement, then you can withdraw this agreement at any time as this will not affect any processing of your personal information done before you withdrew your agreement, nor will it affect processing of your personal information done on a legal basis other than agreement.

How to Protect Your Privacy Rights

To protect your privacy and security, we may take steps to verify your identity, such as a password and user ID if there is an account associated with your request, or identifying information such as your address or date of birth, before proceeding with your request. If you reside in the EEA or Switzerland, we will process any access request you make in accordance with our commitments under the EU-US Privacy Shield or the Swiss-US Privacy Shield.

Please note that if you prefer to submit your request outside of the web form, we will still need to obtain the same relevant information from you in order to process your request, which may result in the process being less prompt. Regardless of how we receive your request, we will abide by all applicable legal requirements for deadlines for responding to your request.

You have the rights to log your complaint to a data protection authority about our collection and use of your personal information. For more information, please contact your local data protection authority.

Safekeeping Data

It is any information that is available for use especially to identify, trace, distinguish or linkable to an individual’s identity.
