SHOW RULES

- 1. This is a varietal (alphabetical) show. All entries will be made in alphabetical order within each class, with the first letter of the name of the rose determining placement in each class.
- 2. This is an open show. The public, as well as members of local rose societies may enter.
- 3. Roses must have been grown in exhibitor's outdoor garden. Domestic partners are considered a "team" of exhibitors and all entries are made in the name of the team.
- 4. Entries must be made in accordance with this Schedule.
- 5. American Rose Society (ARS) rules governing disqualification will be strictly followed including: misnamed, mislabeled or unlabeled entries. The presence of a foreign substance meant to enhance the appearance of the entry would be considered a violation of Show Rules.
- 6. Roses entered must be listed in an ARS publication with an ARS Exhibition Name.
- 7. Only ARS entry tags may be used. Fill in both halves of the tag. Tags must be complete or the entry will suffer disqualification. Tags and vases will be supplied. Wedges may be used, but must not protrude above the lip of the vase.
- 8. Any number of entries may be made in a class by the exhibitor or exhibition team, provided each entry is a different variety. Duplicate entries will be disqualified.
- 9. Entries for one bloom per stem *Hybrid Tea*, *Grandiflora*, *Floribunda*, *Miniature*, *and Miniflora* classes with side buds may be subject to a potential penalization.
- 10. **Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, Floribunda, Miniatures, and Minifloras** with stem-onstem above lip of vase may be subject to a
 potential penalization.

- 11. Entries for all classes of sprays must have **two or more fully formed blooms**. A side bud is not considered to be a bloom.
- 12. *Old Garden Roses, Shrubs* and *Climbers* may be shown as one bloom per stem or **as sprays** without disbudding (side buds are allowed).
- 13. Only *Old Garden Roses* and *Shrubs* may be shown "stem on stem", although a single, straight stem of the same length will merit more points.
- 14. Entries must be in place by the time set forth in this Schedule; no entries may be removed (except by the Show Committee) before the end of the show.
- 15. The Judges' decisions are final. Awards will be given where the specimens warrant them. Judges may withhold awards at their discretion. Best of Show will be chosen from all award winners except Hybrid Tea/ Grandiflora, Miniature, and Miniflora Kings and Princesses.
- 16. The Show Chairman or Co-Chairmen will be responsible for interpreting the Schedule and enforcing the Rules of the Show. No one will be allowed inside the Show venue during judging except those authorized by the Show Committee.
- 17. Neither Alden Lane Nursery nor the Mount Diablo Rose Society will be liable for any loss or damage. All entries become the property of Alden Lane Nursery. Exhibitors are required to remove personal property at the end of the Show.

HELPFUL HINTS:

- * Cut the stems long. They can be shortened at entry time
- * A Hybrid Tea Exhibition bloom should be ½ to ¾ open
- * Fully open blooms have separate classes
- * Blooms should be fresh, without brown edges
- * Healthy green foliage enhances the exhibit
