Thirty years ago in the desert of Saudi Arabia the US Army had the largest modern force placed in the field and were ready to demonstrate what they had been training for since the end of the Vietnam War and the aftermath of the 1973 Arab-Israeli War.


Hopefully in the future we can get together and catch up.

### **Desert Shield - 30 Years**



On January 15, 1991 after Iraq failed to meet the UN deadline the air war begins. Operation Desert Storm had begun.

After more than five weeks of air attacks ground war began on February 24, 1991. In a 100 hour ground campaign that resulted in an armistice on March 3, 1991. (I shipped to Basic on March 12, 1991)

"As far as Saddam Hussein being a great military strategist, he is neither a strategist, nor is he schooled in the operational arts, nor is he a tactician, nor is he a general, nor is he a soldier. Other than that, he's a great military man. I want you to know that."

General H. Norman Schwarzkopf, Commander of Allied Forces in the Persian Gulf, at a press conference, February 28, 1991.

"This time we would try to do it right, we were trying to do it with the right blend of political objectives, decisive military means and making sure that when we had accomplished that objective, we would know it and we could stop the war. The American people understood that, they supported it, and they saw political and military leaders seemed to know what they were doing." General Colin Powell, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, in PBS' "Frontline" Gulf War oral history.



UPI ARCHIVES JANUARY 23, 1991 Powell: 'We're going to cut it off ... kill it' By ELIOT BRENNER

A week into the coalition war against Iraq, senior U.S. military leaders said Wednesday the air battle had gone well and attention is turning to isolating Iraq's half-million man army in the Kuwaiti theater and efforts to "cut it off ... to kill it."

Powell, too, said the campaign had gone about as planned, but noted that cloudy weather retarded the pace of the air attacks and Iraq's use of the Scud missile prompted the reassignment of aircraft to devote more effort to finding and knocking out mobile Scud launchers.

"Notwithstanding these sorts of problems, we're pleased with week one," said Powell, noting allied

control of the air and the fact that no Iraqi plane has managed an attack on a coalition target.






Powell said that with control of the skies established over Iraq, attention will turn to cutting supply and communication lines between Baghdad and the theater where there are 545,000 Iraqi troops in place, to pounding the 110,000 elite Republican Guards in the hopes they will collapse, and to knocking out battlefield air defenses so troop support planes can safely fly lower in the event of a ground war.

"Our strategy to go after this army is very, very simple. First, we're going to cut it off, and then we're going to kill it. To cut it off, that began last week when we started to go after the nerve center, the brains of the operation, the command and control of the operation, and the lines of communication that come out of Baghdad and other places in the country," said Powell.

In detailing the next phase of the campaign, Powell said that as efforts are made to cut off the forces in the Kuwaiti region from Baghdad, allied forces will also go after "his stockpiles, ammunition, food; stripping away their air defense, using air attacks. And ... we are assembling a fairly sizeable ground force that can finish off the job should that be necessary.


"I'm not telegraphing anything. I just want everybody to know that we have a toolbox that's full of lots of tools, and I brought them all to the party. Gen. (Norman) Schwarzkopf has them all at the party," said Powell.






Both patches are also available for \$5 EA.
