


Tank Corps Monument to help get the word out. So I will be looking for volunteers that would like to come out there with me and talk about the monument. Let me know if you can.


A photo that Don Moriarty sent me or that he posted when he took the Tank Stand down to Benning. He commented on the photo as *Echoes*. I took the photo and modified it and added the comment. As I look back now this is fitting. There are *Echoes* of Don all over Facebook now. He was on numerous pages and made numerous comments. That Tank Stand is another item that Don created. Taking an idea I had and making it better.

At the 2nd Annual Tanker Homecoming we had the growlers made. I had the tank stand image drawn up for that. So when I saw the 21st Century Toy tank in 1/16th scale on EBay I bought it. Sanded off the stencils, ordered new stencils and marked it up for the 3rd Annual Tanker Homecoming. The whole time I was showing Don and he was all over it. He love it! He even wanted to bring it in and I had to drop it off for him.

One of the items I had worked up was from Cricket Press was an idea I had for a new tank stand design. I had them create an image of the tank stand and add another level so that we could put USABOT on it. Don loved that artwork. And it wasn't long afterwards that Don wanted the tank. This artwork is on the next page.

He told me that he was working on something but never really told me what it was. He wanted it to be a surprise. So when I arrived for the movie Fury everyone was already talking about the tank stand. Don had it in the hotel set up on a table. The photo on the next page is of the tank stand at Homecoming. You can see some unit insignia laying in front of it. This was the beginning of the Tank Stand.

These are the types of things that Don would do. You never really knew what to expect if you got a message from him. He was always into something. A project here or there. Helping someone look for information or clarification on something. He was on so many pages on Facebook it was strange to see where he may pop up.

These little "projects" he would share on Facebook. Like when he found the letters off the US Cavalry store and had them in his back yard. He wired them up and plugged them in. His response was "They are so bright I don't think I can have them on inside..."

His red rollback for Gold City Towing was his rolling office. It was at all of our meetings that he attended. I was always on the lookout for it. Plus he was always sharing the odd and exotic that he might be hauling. Or photos of him tearing into it like one of the vintage military vehicles he have worked on.

Of the many things that Don was known for was his work on the restoration of the M50A1 Ontos. The other is Cobra King. Two things that if you got him talking about you were in for a long discussion. I listened to Don talk about Cobra King at a 37th Tank Regiment reunion. We featured that talk in our June 2017 issue of the newsletter.


Don in a conversation when people asked what he did replied with "I am an Armor Archaeologist." This came up when people were talking about his passing. I don't think that there is any better way to describe Don Moriarty. In all of the times that we had talked he never really mentioned his rank or spe-



It was an honor and privilege to be his friend and to know him. We will miss him.











# 22 Challenge 10K Ruck March

#### **NEWLY ARRIVED!!!!**

The Treat'em Rough and Tank Destroyer soft PVC Vinyl patches! These patched come with the Hook and Loop backing so they can be sewn onto anything.

The Tank Destroyer patch is the exact same size as the TD sticker. 3".

The Treat'em Rough patch is slightly larger than the decal. 4" x 3".



These are both on the website! These are \$10 each!







We finally have artwork for the 100 Years of Armor sprocket design. I had Cricket Press in Lexington do the work. As always they nailed it!

I have 100 of these and as soon as we get them up on the website we will have them available.

These will run the same as the other stickers which are \$5.

This design of 100 Years of Armor starts with the sprocket of the FT-17 Renault, centered, with a sprocket of an M1A2 on the outside. 100 years of driving track!

These stickers are made the same as the Treat'em Rough and TD stickers.

#### PRINTABLE VINYL


The 5 year durability of our pure white vinyl keeps your stickers looking sharp for years. Our vinyl can be stretched slightly to help adhere to curves.

These are the same 11oz Diner mug. Cost will be the same as the Treat'em Rough mug, \$25.


I originally ordered the minimum of these as we were not sure of how well these will go over. So I had 47 of these to start with but I am down to 41 as of this time.




Both patches are also available for \$5 EA.


