The Common Sense Way by Pete Blaber

In his new book, "The Common Sense Way; A New Way To Think About Leading and Organizing," Pete Blaber former Delta Force Operator, talks about leading and organizing. It was while reading the book that it hit me that this seems to be the way MG John S. Wood lead the 4th Armored Division. So here are some takeaways.

Learn, Adapt, Interact

Learn – a. to gain knowledge or understanding of or skill in by study, instruction, or experience

- b. to come to be able
- c. to come to realize
- d. to come to know

Adapt – See Above

Interact – to act upon one another

Develop The Situation or D-T-S


"Develop" means to bring out the possibility or potential of something. "Situation" refers to what's going on around us in the context of the moment. As a method, "Develop the Situation" means to bring out the possibility and potential of what's going on around us in the context of the moment. As a mindset, we bring out the possibility and potential of something when we take time to think about it.

Gravity, Energy, Time

Gravity – What goes up must come down, applies anywhere anytime

Energy – The speed of light is constant

Time – Time only moves in one direction



The conflicts that create the most friction between leaders and their teams (e.g. combat, business, sports) emerge from the contradictions between "the way" leaders tell their people what to do (e.g. strategy, plans, disconnected chains of command) and "the way" the adaptive stimulus of what's going on around us in the context of the moment reveals what we should do.

To lay the foundations for successful choice making, "common sense leaders" don't tell their people what to do or how to choose. Instead they "prime" their people's mind by saying out loud and sharing their "common purpose" along with all the context specific knowledge of patterns and principles they've learned to accomplish it. In aggregate: the "foundational logic of why" they do what they do and choose what they choose.

What is Foundational Logic of Why?

Foundation is the basis on which a thing stands and/or is supported.

Logic is a neural process that describes the way our neocortex learns, organizes and retrieves context-specific knowledge of patterns to reveal patterns and relationships that "make sense" of the world. To "make logical sense" of any pattern our neocortex needs a purpose.

Why refers to the cause, reason, or purpose for which something is done.


FLOW is a metaphor for "the biologic way" our thinking brains learn, organize and retrieve knowledge of patterns to accomplish any purpose. When said out loud and shared, FLOW provides our brains with common sense of shared purpose and direction for accomplishing it.

Priming – Leaders lay the foundation for successful choice-making by priming their people's minds with a "foundation" of context-specific "knowledge of patterns."

Priming is an unconscious form of human memory whereby exposure to one stimulus (e.g. a word, guiding principle or image) influences the way the brain responds to a subsequent stimulus.

Combat leaders "prime" their teams before every mission.

This is book 2 of 3. Book one is The Mission, the Men and Me.



Heartbreak Ridge

While reading this book of brought back memories of my first lessons in training. Ones I actually applied while serving.

Improvise, Overcome, Adapt – Clint Eastwood's character, Gunnery Sergeant Thomas Highway in the 1986 movie "*Heartbreak Ridge*" recited this to his Marine's over and over. It was something that always stuck in my head.

Improvise – a. to make, invent, or arrange offhand

b. to make or fabricate out of what is conveniently on hand

Overcome – a. to get the better of

b. OVERWHELM

c. to gain the superiority

Adapt – a. to make fit (as for a new use) often by modification

b. to become adapted


The other favorite saying that stuck with me from Heartbreak Ridge.



The Tank Destroyer patch is the exact same size as the TD sticker. 3".


The Treat'em Rough patch is slightly larger than the decal. 4" x 3".






Both patches are also available for \$5 EA.
