Max was rescued eight years ago through Northeast Ohio Collie Rescue. I was told he was a stud dog, lived outside in a muddy back yard his whole life and didn't know what a bed was. The night we brought him home, he crawled into bed with me and we slept back to back for nine solid hours. We were instant soulmates. He loved everyone, wanted to meet new people and dogs, and if a dog didn't like him, he would take a big detour. He lived a charmed life—a long walk in the woods most days, neighbors who loved him, a collie buddy, kitties who loved and trusted him, a beach to hang out at all summer and kisses and hugs from me everyday.

Max died peacefully the night of August 9. Like the night we brought him home, we slept back to back. He passed

away peacefully in the very early morning. I asked him to give me his spirit as he was the most beautiful soul. Thank you, NEOCR, for the dog of a lifetime.



Directions to Hubbard Valley Park, Medina County...

Hubbard Valley Park is located at 8600 Hubbard Valley Road, Seville, OH Located south of Blake Road and north of Greenwich Road



From the North:

- Take I-71 south to I-76 East/ US 224 East, Exit 209 toward Akron
- Take the Ohio Rt. 3, Exit 2, toward Medina/Seville
- Turn RIGHT onto Wooster Pike/ OH Rt. 3
- Turn LEFT onto Greenwich Road/CR 97
- Turn LEFT onto Hubbard Valley Road

From the Northeast:

- Take I-271 South to I-71 South
- Follow above directions

From the West (or East):

- Take I-480 East (or West) to I-71 South
- Follow first set of directions

From the Akron area:

- Take I-76 West to OH Rt. 3, Exit 2, toward Medina/Seville
- Turn LEFT onto Wooster Pike/ OH Rt. 3
- Turn LEFT onto Greenwich Road/CR 97
- Turn LEFT onto Hubbard Valley Road

From the South:

- Take I-71 North to I-76 East/ US 224 East, Exit 209 toward Akron
- Continue with first set of directions
