the dog had never ridden in a car, but he settled down listening to classical singer Jonathan Antoine on his way to his foster home. What happened next was the result of loving care first by his foster family then by his adoptive mom, Tina Pasvanis. His medical conditions were resolved. This dog named Lance went from running in circles to walking forward on a leash to taking walks in the park and neighborhood. He no longer jumps on people and understands "down" and other commands. No destructive chewing. Tina plays fetch in the backyard and he gladly retrieves the ball. After many months of working at home, Tina has no reservations leaving him home as he is calm and behaves while she goes to work several days a week. Visiting relatives with dogs is a pleasant event as he gets along with their dogs. His new name? Chance. Yes, we took a chance on this lovely dog.

Election for NorthEast Ohio Collie Rescue

On **Sunday August 15th at 2 p.m.** the next meeting of the NorthEast Ohio Collie Rescue will be in the Community Room at Jennings Hall, 10200 Granger Road, Garfield Heights. It's the only 4-story building on the premises. Elections will be held for the following positions: President, Secretary/Treasurer and three Board member positions. Nominations can be accepted the day of the meeting. Terms will be until December 2022. Nominated candidates submitted these statements:

For President:

Beverly Briggs - My assuming office has solidified the continuing operation of NEOCR. I have presided at meetings. I have fiercely promoted the humane treatment of our beloved collies through fund raising and education while directing rescue efforts, transportation, and veterinarian care. All while arranging foster care, rehabilitation, and training as I review requests to be a forever home. Throughout these fifteen [15] years, I have delegated necessary collie assistance to our volunteering members without raising any distrust or dissension among us. Serving as President is the best way I can participate in our collie rescue: since I now have limited mobility and am unable to drive. Our Rescue is a small group of uniquely talented, interesting, and committed collie lovers of which I am one. As a group we have rescued and placed in forever homes hundreds of our precious collies. A Vote for me will continue to maintain the sterling reputation and consistency of NEOCR since 1995. Thank You.

Roseann Cyngier - It is very easy to stand on the sidelines and talk about the way things are. I do not seek such a seat of comfort. Instead, I offer to roll up my sleeves, dedicate my energies and help to take this organization to another level. With my experience as Adoption Coordinator, I have demonstrated my care and love for many dogs since appointed last year. Each dog is in a happy, safe home and I visit them on my own time when practical. My husband and I have fostered several collies, each of whom takes a piece of our heart when they move on. I drove over 2000 miles traveling to rescue dogs, visit fosters and potential adopters. As Events Coordinator, my organizational and planning skills have resulted in our first COLLIE FEST which had over 80 collies in attendance, ten autumn Collie Walks in parks, a holiday party with open house and more. For fundraising, I have organized two social media campaigns, Giving Tuesday fundraiser and a dog wash, raising over \$2000 for our rescue. I have the desire to help collies in need. For me, it's all about the best interest of the collies. I hope to inspire others to work side-by-side with me and our leadership team. To that end, I humbly ask for your vote for the Presidency.

For Secretary/Treasurer:

Leo Kenzik - I have been Treasurer of NorthEast Ohio Collie Rescue for over 10 years. I have put out quarterly Treasurer reports, updated the contributor list for the newsletter. To generate income, we have started PayPal donations and Amazon Smile. 92 cents out of every dollar donated goes directly to care for the dogs. I have donated all of the office supplies used for the treasurer's duty's IE: postage, envelopes, paper and printer ink to keep costs down. I would like your vote to continue as Treasurer of NorthEast Ohio Collie Rescue for the rest of 2021 and into 2022.

Board Positions - 3 Available

Deanna Carroll - I would like to nominate myself, Deanna Carroll, for a board position with the Northeast Ohio Collie rescue. I have knowledge and experience with the Collie breed. My mother was a breeder for over 30 years. I also breed Rough Collies and have a background in grooming. I would bring to the table ideas, knowledge, and youthfulness. I was a part of a rescue group in Rowlett, TX as well as a volunteer at the Rowlett Animal Shelter. I think the NEOCR would benefit with me on the board. Thank you for your time.

Tom Hoadley - The last year and a half has posed many challenges for us all, and NEOCR is no exception. We are faced with having to re-group in order to remain an effective rescue for collies now, and in the future. To do so will require a major revision to the constitution, or even a completely new one, particularly recognizing the changes in communication that have been brought about by the almost ubiquitous use of the internet. A restart of the membership program is also needed as well as a concerted effort to attract, cultivate, and retain members who have the skills that a previous generation of rescue volunteers never needed, and may not have.

I believe that, with my 20+ years' experience with the group, many as president, I can help by serving as a facilitator and mediator as NEOCR changes to meet the demands of the future.

Kathlene Myron - It is my pleasure to serve the Collie Rescue community as a board member. My opinions in this matter include the following:

- Each Collie (or mix) will be treated with dignity and respect, receiving medical/ behavioral care necessary to be adoptable.
 - advocacy for the Collie first.
 - collaboration among all Board Members in Decision making process.
 - collaboration among Board members to get things done in a timely manner.
 - provide evidence based strategies and business models that are efficient to successfully implement and carry out good business practices.
- *I promise to uphold my subjective and objective rationales in the decision making process.

Don Stewart - Hi my name's Don Stewart. I live in Youngstown Ohio. I'm originally from Bay City Michigan. I've been on disability retirement for the last 7 years. I have 2 Rough Collies, Gracie and Trinity. I have a grooming salon set up in my basement dedicated to the 2 of them. I'm willing to be the Foster Coordinator; I would also help with transportation and emergency temporary fostering.
