




Safety Officer; "Blurbs Blog": This month's article is on a very important topic and an article I originally ran 3 years ago but worth a reprint!

"Tires"... Weather Cracking & More!

Tires are subjected to being stretched millions of times as they roll through their life. Tires are exposed to acid rain, brake dust, harsh chemicals and direct sunlight, as well as summer's heat and winter's cold. And while a tire's rubber compounds do contain anti-aging

chemicals in their recipes, exposure to the elements will eventually cause rubber to lose some of its elasticity and allow surface cracks to appear.



The surface cracks that occasionally appear have been called many things; Weather Checking, Weather Cracking or Ozone Cracking. These small cracks typically develop in the sidewalls or at the base of the tread grooves. Depending on their severity, they may be cosmetic in nature if they don't extend past the rubber's outer surface, or may be a reason to replace the tire if they reach deep into the rubber.

Because all tires are made of rubber, all tires will eventually

exhibit some type of cracking condition, usually late in their life. However, this cracking can be accelerated by too much exposure to heat, vehicle exhaust, ozone and sunlight.

The excessive use of tire cleaners/dressings can inadvertently remove some of the tire's anti-

oxidants and anti-ozone protection during every cleaning procedure. Interestingly enough, when sun exposure or excessive cleaning is the cause of the small cracks, the sidewall of the tire facing outward will show damage, while the sidewall facing inward is rarely affected.

Dunlop Tire Co. recently issued some tips for motorcyclists regarding the tire inspection for motorcyclists. The tire company says "two items are of vital importance: always check your tire pressures before you ride, and always know



your load limit." Below are some additional tips from Mike Manning, Dunlop Motorcycle Tires Product Manager.

Additional Motorcycle Tire Tips From Dunlop: Before setting out, especially on long rides, be sure to check your motorcycle's load limit in the owner's manual against the total weight of rider and

passenger with riding gear, plus all cargo. Exceeding that limit could lead to sudden tire failure and can seriously compromise your safety.

- Maintaining the correct air pressures is crucial to the tires' rolling efficiency, steering, grip, wear and load-carrying capabilities-<u>for every 4 psi a tire is underinflated, you lose 80 pounds of loadcarrying capacity</u>. Remember, the air in your tires helps carry all of the load including your motorcycle, you, your passenger and all your cargo, so check cold air pressures as often as possible with a high-quality air-pressure gauge. Checking tire pressures is the most important tire maintenance function you can perform.

And finally, in closing: Think "T-CLOCK" ... A handy and easy-to-remember checklist which begins with the all-important T, which stands for tires (C – Controls, L – Lights, O – Oil, C – Chassis, K – Kickstand).

ANY doubt about "anything" while inspecting your bike, be sure to bring it to *McDermott's Harley Davidson* and have them check it out for you! Always best to be safe!

Historian; "Blurbs Blog":

<u>Fort Edward Brief History Part 1</u>: (Next month: Part 2...and the following month will be Part 3: A Chronology of Fort Edward and Rogers Island)!

#### PART 1:

In 1700, the area known today as Fort Edward was still wilderness. Prior to the construction of any forts, the area was known by the old Indian name Wahcoloosencoochaleva or the "Great Carrying Place."

At this point on the Hudson River with rapids and falls, further travel by water to the north was

not possible. The Native Americans would leave the Hudson at Bond Creek carrying their canoes overland to the headwaters of Lake Champlain.


War played an important part in the early development of this area. Sir Francis Nicholson was sent here during Queen Anne's War to erect a stockade and build a road to Fort Ann in 1709. This fortification because known as Fort Nicholson only to be abandoned shortly thereafter.



In 1731, John Henry Lydius, a Dutchman from

Albany, erected a fur trading post here known as Lydius House or Fort Lydius. This was Fort Edward's first documented structure. A sketch of this house was included in a survey made by a Frenchman named Anger in 1732.

Again, war caused the construction of another fort under the direction of Phinehas Lyman during the French and Indian War. Sir William Johnson changed the name of the Fort from Fort Lyman to Fort Edward on September 21, 1755. It was named in honor of Edward, Duke of York and Albany, grandson of George II and brother of George III. At this time a large military hospital



complex was constructed on the island, presently known as Rogers Island.

Shortly before the Revolutionary War, the fortifications were dismantled. Now the War of Independence put Fort Edward on the "Great War Path" once again. With the fortifications in ruins, Fort Edward was defenseless. Schuyler retreated to Saratoga and Fort Edward came under Burgoyne's occupation. In 1777, an event took place here which has been said to have changed the course of the Revolution. With the tragic murder of Jane McCrea, many area settlers took up arms against the British and helped to cause Burgoyne's defeat in Saratoga.

After the war little is known of Fort Edward's early settlers. A post office was established in the village of Fort Edward in 1798 with Matthias Ogden acting as postmaster. The town of Fort Edward as it is known today was created by an act of the legislature passed on April 10, 1818. The first town meeting was held on May 22 of that year at the dwelling house of Solomon Emmons. Moses Cary was elected supervisor and Walter Rogers became the first town clerk.

Durkeetown, located in the eastern section of Fort Edward was settled by Solomon Durkee, one of the first settlers. The Baptist Church which is still active there, was established in 1832. The old District #5 schoolhouse on the Durkeetown Road no longer stands.

The settlement of Moses Kill located on the Hudson River in the southern section of town takes its name from the stream which flows into the Hudson at this point. A post office was established in 1872 and for a short time, the name of Mock was used for this hamlet. Susan B. Anthony taught school here in her early life.



The Village of Fort Edward is the most densely populated section of the Town of Fort Edward. In September of 1849, the Village was incorporated and at that time it contained one thousand acres. The first village meeting was held at the home of Gideon Carswell on Broadway, now known as the Charter House. Frederick D. Hodgeman was elected the first president of the village. The term president was used up until 1927 when the

title was changed to mayor. Hodgeman and Palser opened a paper manufacturing plant in 1850. The Fort Edward Blast Furnace was erected and put into operation in 1854. Bessemer pig iron was produced with ores being obtained from Crown Point and Fort Ann.

Sawmills were also located in this area along the river near the dam. In 1846 the firms of Tefft & Russell and Bradley & Underwood established sawmills there. George Bradley of the latter firm was one of Fort Edward's most successful businessmen. In 1870 he purchased the Opera House from Bob Allen. Operas, concerts, and road shows were held in the Bradley Opera House which boasted a seating capacity of one thousand people.




