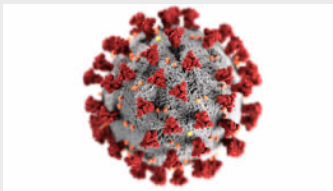

A walk thru History with Andrew Stowell

If you happen to find yourself wandering around the Black Hills of South Dakota during August, you will see an absolutely amazing landscape. You may also see sunny days with nearly record high temperatures, torrential rain, thunder and lightning, and sometimes hail big enough to total a car. And there's something else you'll see in the black hills in August. Motorcycles! Thousands of them. They come from every state and around the world from all walks of life to celebrate the motorcycle culture, ride the black hills and have some fun.

Every August for the past 80 years, Sturgis South Dakota has hosted the largest motorcycle rally in the country. The rally was started by the Jackpine Gypsies in 1938 and has grown over the years to what has become the largest longest running motorcycle event going.

It's like the Superbowl of the motorcycle riding season. There's flat track racing, motocross, hill climbs, road tours, concerts, stunt shows, vendors and plenty of attractions and distractions to keep everyone entertained when they're not actually riding their motorcycles.

And the riding is spectacular. Devils Tower, Mount Rushmore, Crazy Horse, Spearfish Canyon, Needles Highway, Iron Mountain Road and Custer State Park. The nearby towns of Deadwood, Keystone and Rapid City. When you're tired out from all that riding, there's a few places to eat and get a beer around the corner or just down the road a ways. Then there are a few concerts for your off-road entertainment. I recognize the names of some of the bands. Other bands names, not so much.

I'm sure it will look different this year compared to what the first year looked like. The one constant for the past 80 years is the motorcycles. Two wheels and your knees in the breeze. It doesn't matter what type of bike you ride, only that you do.
