Hard to believe "meteorologic fall" is already here. Astronomic fall will not occur until September 21, with the autumnal equinox. The way I know it is coming is I have to change the timers for the lights around the house and the need to clean the windshield in my car due to the lower sun angles, very scientific! The other thing that lets you know it's happening is the rapid change in temperature once the sun sets.

So on the sun angle, be sure to have some really good sunglasses, preferably with polarized lenses, to help with that glare and the light and dark areas that can hide road hazards.

Concerning the temperatures, even though winter is not here, yet, the potential for hypothermia starts when temperatures start fall between 50 and 30 degrees according to the National Weather Service. Here is a chart that shows what the temperatures are at motorcycle riding speeds, courtesy of <https://www.cyclefish.com/blogs/72/768>:

So you can see, when the temperatures get down to 55 degrees, at any speed, the potential for hypothermia begins, even as slow as 25 mph, the temperature is 49 degrees.

Symptoms of hypothermia are, according to the CDC: shivering, exhaustion, confusion (difficulty thinking clearly) fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech and drowsiness, all of which can affect our ability to control our motorcycles and operate them safely. For more information on both hypothermia and frostbite see their webpage at <https://www.cdc.gov/disasters/winter/staysafe/hypothermia.html>. If you start to experience them the best thing to do is to find a heated place where you can rest until you have recovered from them and can get home or to your destination safely.

That is also a good time to put on some additional protective clothing. So be sure to have additional layers to add to your riding ensemble if you will not get home or to your destination before sunset. That should include a wind breaking outer layer, a middle insulation layer(s) and a base layer that will wick moisture away to keep you dry. And you will want the same protection for your hands and feet! Enjoy the late riding season, but be prepared for the challenges it presents!
