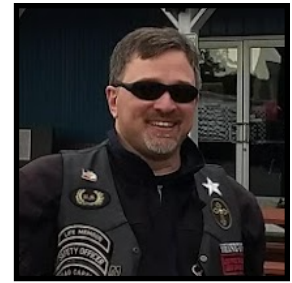

Hi everyone, hard to believe it is July already, Americade and Laconia are in the books and our Chapter picnic is on the horizon.

We have had great riding weather, much better than the wash out last year, although my plants could use a little more "natural" watering. Even with the crazy gas prices, still not terrible having to fill up a 3-gallon, Street Bob, or 6-gallon tank, even with the non-ethanol 91 octane.

I did give a summary of the new exhaust laws at the May meeting, so for those who missed it, here is a quick summary. The old rule still stands, which is you cannot modify your exhaust to be louder than the original equipment. This is hard to enforce as there are no real records stating the sound level of original exhaust systems, that I could find on line. Also, if the exhaust change shifts the frequency lower, the sound is deeper, they do not register as high on the sound testing that is adjusted for human hearing, called the A weighting scale.

The real change is inspection stations cannot inspect motorcycles fitted with drag pipes, any system without baffles, or a system that is designed to allow the baffles to be easily removed, or by-passed. So for most, these changes should not present a problem.

So, as everyone is likely aware, this year has been significantly drier than last year, which is good for riding, but can present some safety concerns.

The primary concern is with less rain, the oil and other fluids that leak from vehicles stays on and gets absorbed into the pavement, especially asphalt. When it does rain, they can be released and make the lane center oil slick worse than normal. So, when you are out, do you best to avoid riding in the center of your lane, especially if it is raining.



As always be thinking about your exposure to the sun and if you burn easily like me be sure to put on a higher power sun screen. Because it takes time for the sunscreen to be absorbed into your skin, the recommendation is to put it on about 30 minutes before going out into the sun. It is also recommended that you reapply it about every two hours for maximum protection.

As always stay hydrated to avoid heat stress, which can have the same effects as drinking alcohol.
