Have you ever had a day, maybe a week, when your mind is just unsettled? You sit down to do something, a task on your to-do list, and stare at it. Or you start, and then you derail yourself mentally or physically in a hundred different ways.



This has been my experience trying to write this article for the newsletter. It is the last piece that Alyssa is waiting for. The deadline has come! I will share that I have started three different articles that I thought I wanted to write. They are the start of three pieces, but they stalled out as I tried to conclude them. Don't worry. I was taught never to get rid of any idea that something might come of it, so they are in my ideas for the future folder. You may see them someday.

The world is heavy right now for us all. I don't know if that has anything to do with this month's struggle with the article. It is Lent, which is extra work, which may be some of it. It could be that I really miss the sunshine, and this time of the year, it is the gray and overcast months. I have tried to pinpoint it but to no avail.

In general, my colleagues feel the same way. So, I take some comfort in that. I thought I would let you know some of the things that are weighing heavy on the hearts and minds of at least this Pastor, your Pastor.

This month, the other pastors in Manitowoc and I were asked to be present for a meeting at Faith Lutheran in Valders to provide a space for members of Our Saviors Lutheran in Denmark to come and get clarification about the ELCA. They have already done the initial vote and will vote soon to leave the ELCA. I wish the people of this church and community nothing but the best as they discern the best path for their future and their faith journey. The rising tide of conservative thinking and feeling has me rattled as your Pastor and as a person of faith.

I want to bring you news of good news and hope each Sunday, but I also struggle with not putting our heads in the sand as Christians and standing by as our neighbors are oppressed, deported, and legislated into having no legal standing. The Lutherans have a long history of providing social services to those in need domestically and internationally (our work rivals that of Catholic Charities), and to see that being torn apart brick by brick is hard – it is made harder now that I am part of the system.

I know that people come to church to escape the world outside our doors. They come to connect with the people who are their family and support, and that is priceless. I never want to make people feel like the church is another place where the world is pressing in on them. The conundrum comes for me because scripture tells us Jesus acted. Jesus acted on behalf of the marginalized, the ostracized, the sick, and the needy. Jesus challenged and debated the people who spouted the law and did so with zeal and

passion. Jesus did so without diminishing or belittling those spouting law or ordering his crucifixion. Jesus maintained everyone's dignity.

Jesus is perfect, and we are not. I know and accept that. I will fail at being your Pastor along the way. I will upset some of you. I will push you in ways that you may not want to be pushed. I will also let you sit in comfortable spaces when I should be doing more. But I will love and care for each of you along the way.

I am not sure that this is the most organized article I have ever written, thought-wise, but it feels good like I have offered some thoughts and wisdom to you.

The call from Jesus is daily. Our answer is by the minute. We work to do as much as we can with what we have at the moment.

- With God as our source of all things, we approach this world and each other with love and a forgiving spirit.
- With Jesus as our example, we serve our church and our community in the world
- With the Holy Spirit to guide our way, we choose to do God's will in how we live, treat each other, and make decisions.



Brunch will be served following the 10:15am worship service. Egg bakes, fruit, bakery items, juice, coffee, & milk will be served.


