Notes from the Pastor's Chair

I sat down to think about what to write about for the June article and was stumped for a while. A good fallback is always a holiday or event in the month, but June is a bit dry for events. But as I prepared for the week, I started thinking about Memorial Day and I couldn't shake it.

I grew up in a military family. My dad was a career Air Force, retiring after 27 years as a MSGT. He then went on to work another twenty years in civil service, doing the same job for the Air Force. My dad was deployed to the Korean Conflict and Vietnam. He saw combat in Korea in addition to setting up Mobile Army Surgical Hospitals. My dad's passion in his later years was to work to make the men and women who fought and died in Korea remembered. For the longest time Korea was known as the "Forgotten War."

My mother also served four years in the Air Force. That is where my parents met. But in 1953, if a woman got pregnant, even if married, it was an automatic discharge.

I had siblings follow in my dad's footsteps, joining the military. One brother, Air Force, retired after thirty years. And the other, Navy four years, discharged due to injury. Truth be told, after joining AirForce ROTC (Reserve Officer Training Corp) in high school, I entertained the thought of the Military for several years instead of college.

When my dad retired, we moved to a community that was made up of military retirees. I have had numerous friends join the military. I have seen the impact of death, severe injury, illness, and PTSD on those who served and their families over the years.

My dad was a very quiet man. We never had a flag in the house, and we didn't go to Memorial or Veteran's Day parades or celebrations. My father and the fathers of my friends weren't interested in making a big deal.

I had a brother-in-law who returned from Vietnam and was disrespected in unimaginable ways, but they continued to serve their country.

So, you're asking yourself what this has to do with church or God? As a person, I struggle with the new religion that has formed around the American flag. Flags are secular symbols. They are used to stake territory or to claim ownership. Think back to the Russians planting a flag two miles down under the ice cap in the North Sea in 2007.

My apprehensions about Memorial Day, Veterans Day and flags can be summed up in this. What is the priority? Have we lost sight of God and Jesus? Not as a nation but as people. The flag doesn't show us how to care for our neighbors. The parades and celebrations are good but after that day, do we continue to care for those that came home from the war and are sick? Church is a community. Church is reaching out to the outcast, the unwelcome, and the unloved. Church is about putting Jesus at the center. This is hard, hard work. We are pulled in so many directions by all the shiny and cool things, by fear and doubt, and by our own brokenness. The important thing to remember is that Jesus is always with us.

We stand with our country and our flag, but we must not confuse it with our God. A country is a human-made thing, as prone to failings as the people who made it. We should not pretend otherwise. G.K. Chesterton said, "My country, right or wrong,' is a thing that no patriot would think of saying. It is like saying, 'My mother, drunk or sober." God welcomed all, redeemed all, and made all new in Christ. If we want a country based on Christian ideals, then we should look to the words of Christ. "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28). That includes the tired, the poor, the huddled masses.



Did you know that St. Paul has a wonderful team of people who deliver Meals on Wheels in our community? This service enables the homebound to receive one hot meal and one cold meal each day Monday through Friday. St. Paul has one of the easiest routes as we deliver to about 20 individuals in four or five locations. We always work in pairs, and it only takes about an hour. St. Paul is responsible for one week's deliveries every four to six weeks. When we have enough volunteers, each set of partners is responsible for one day.

Behind the Scenes with Shirley & Jan

Shirley and Jan have been a part of the St. Paul family for a combined total of 121 years! Can you even believe it!?!?! Shirley has been a member at St. Paul for 32 years and Jan has been a part of St. Paul since she was 4 years old (that was 89 years ago)!

Shirley worked for the Mirro company for 32 years in the Sales Department. While not a salesperson, she worked behind the scenes to keep the sales department running. She has four children, 9 grandchildren, 15 great-grandchildren, and two great-great grandchildren! That's quite a family!

Jan is 93 years young. As a young woman, she joined the military and worked in the Army Medical Corp (a specialized group of OTs, PTs, and dieticians). After she left the military, she had a remarkable career and many of the physical & occupational rehab services we have in nursing homes today exist because of the work that Jan did. If you know Jan or have the chance to meet her, ask her to tell you all about it. It's quite fascinating!

Each week Shirley and Jan come to St. Paul on

Thursdays to fold bulletins for Sunday's worship services at St. Paul & Calvary. They also take care of folding and mailing monthly newsletters to those who get a paper copy. They are involved in Meals on Wheels, Women of Worship (WOW), and Shirley is involved with Faith Circle. In the past they have volunteered to do SCRIP, volunteer for the Altar Guild, and Church Council, and have even spent time scrubbing bathroom floors once when the church was without a custodian! They believe that St. Paul is a family and as members of the family, they have willing hearts to help where needed.

Shirley and Jan describe the people of St. Paul as a family who are friendly and provide a comfortable and safe place to belong for anyone who comes through the doors. The people they've met here and the relationships they have made over the years are incredibly important to these remarkable women and it shows in the dedication and love they give back to others, even if a lot of it is behind the scenes.

Calvary's Quilters: A Labor of Love



Did you know that Calvary's quilting group is making a difference around the globe?

This small group of women meet every Tuesday from 9am-11am. They work on putting together quilts that are sent to Lutheran World Relief each October. From there, these quilts are circulated around the world to those in need.

In the past, quilts have gone to Louisiana after Hurricane Katrina. A few years back quilts were sent to Fort McCoy in Wisconsin for incoming refugees. Many quilts go to South America and Africa and wherever else there is a need. This amazing bunch has also donated quilts in the past to benefits for The Haven (a men's homeless shelter in Manitowoc), the Pink Heals campaign, and Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. They are extremely proud that their quilt received the highest bid at the Children's Hospital fundraiser that year!

Quilting is a beautiful art-form and to participate with this group you need zero sewing experience! Yup! You read that correctly! Uf you can insert pins into fabric or tie a knot, you are welcome to join them. They will happily show you the ropes and get you settled in. You don't need to be a member of Calvary to participate. These ladies welcome everyone! Sometimes there are even cookies!

All fabric is donated, and they will recycle and reuse whatever they can find! A unique part of this group is that two of the group members sort through all the fabric that is donated and match up colors and patterns that will work well together. Then they take that fabric home and sew the quilt tops together. Once that's finished the quilt top is paired with coordinating fabric for the backside of the quilt and it's folded up neatly and stored until the Tuesday group assembles it.



HAPPY 12TH BIRTHDAY TO SCRIP AT ST. PAUL

In April, our SCRIP program turned 12 years old! SCRIP has helped our church with financial support over the last 12 years by contributing \$63,750! The amazing fact about this program is that it doesn't require you to give "extra" but just purchase SCRIP cards for things you already need: gas, groceries, restaurants, etc. The church receives a percentage of each gift card that is purchased.

Thank you to everyone who is in the regular habit of buying SCRIP cards. What a benefit this program has been to our congregation! Thank you to our members who make this program possible: Joy Carlson, Shirley Osieczanek, Sharon Schwantes, and Jan Chermak. There is a list in the office on the board of all SCRIP available, plus there are many more available for order. Stop in on Sunday mornings to purchase. Currently Alyssa does not handle SCRIP, so you will need to make purchases on Sundays.

Unfortunately, sales are down dramatically for our SCRIP program this year. Last year at this time we sold \$17, 353 in SCRIP and this year we have sold \$9,725 so far. This isn't sustainable for the program to continue. We'll watch in the coming months to see if sales pick up and brainstorm ideas about its future.
