Notes from the Pastor's Chair

Sometimes the ideas and words for the monthly column come quickly and easily. A topic always seems to pop into my head. That hasn't happened to me this time. There have been multiple attempts at starting an article with it just puttering out into nothing.

The most promising start that I made was on how August is 'Back to School' season for most of the world and how can we look at this season as followers of Jesus to recenter ourselves around our faith.

I was drawing a connection between January and the tradition of making New Year resolutions and how those of us without children returning to school ask ourselves what we could get 'back to'. I was primarily thinking of ways that we could try to refocus our lives and the way we live them around the teachings of Jesus.

I was super excited about this topic until I got into writing about it and then I kept hearing echoes of Evangelical Christian leaders' calls to return to the ways of Jesus or else. Or the messages of some leaders that there is only one way to worship Jesus - their way - and any other way is wrong and you are wrong for even considering it.

It all became too overwhelming. I believe and trust in a God that showered the world with unconditional grace, mercy, and forgiveness. I believe and trust in a God that sought out and gathered in those that were marginalized by their communities. I believe and trust in a God that welcomes all unconditionally.

This is not the message I and a lot of my generation heard from the mainstream church. That did some terrible things to people's faith. It turned them away from Church because they were unable to distinguish between the messages that they were hearing and God.

The messages that some Christian leaders and followers are putting out aren't getting any worse - they are just getting louder, better marketed, and more importantly, they continue to be the majority voice being heard in the world.

This is why it was hard for me to continue to write the article about getting back to Jesus and a Jesus-centered life. It felt too much like the ads and messages of those that want to pick and choose what God calls us to do.

Of course, there is room for improvement in the church. We, as followers of a man that spent his entire earthly ministry challenging leadership, questioning the status quo, and working for equality and justice for the marginalized, always have work to do in this world.

God told us that we would always have the poor and hungry, and we do. God calls us to care for the strangers in our midst and even in the 21st century with all our technology, strangers still walk among us. God calls us to care for those that can't care for themselves – the elderly and the young.

So, I guess in the end I did write an article about the things that are important to us as followers of Jesus, but it was also important to tell you about the struggles of writing this piece in the current political climate. The world was and is a scary place. Some days are better than others. It is easy to forget that our time and God's time are not the same and that God is always present with us. This doesn't make our fears magically disappear and the world a shiny happy place. But our faith and hope in a God that showers us with grace, mercy, and forgiveness should drive us to do the best we can every day in whatever ways we can.

St. Paul has one of the easiest routes as we deliver to about 20 individuals in four or five locations. We always work in pairs, and it only takes about an hour. St. Paul is responsible for one week's deliveries every four to six weeks. When we have enough volunteers, each set of partners is responsible for one day.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KITS AT ST. PAUL

Beginning the first Sunday in July, we will be collecting items to create School Kits which will be distributed through Lutheran World Relief. These kits are given to families affected by

ongoing conflicts and severe weather around the globe.

Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that all children, especially girls, can attend school in places where their access is not a priority has even stronger results. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children - and in some cases, adults – continue learning in the face of adversity. That learning leads to a better life, not only for them, but for their families and communities. There will be a collection area in the narthex for your donations. Items will be collected through Sunday, September 8th. This is a great project that the entire congregation is invited to take part in!

The supplies needed for <u>each</u> kit are:

- (4) 70 sheet notebooks, wide or college ruled*(1) 12-inch ruler (with both inches and centimeters)
- (1) box of 16 or 24 count crayons
- (1) pencil sharpener
- (1) pair of blunt scissors
- (5) unsharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers.
- (5) black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- (1) 2 ¹/₂ inch eraser
- *Indicates the most needed item.

Mary was born in Maine, Abby in North Caroline, Kelly in Iowa, and James was born in Wisconsin. John is currently the Officer in Charge of ANT Two Rivers. For those of us who don't speak Coast Guard acronym, (It's ok if you don't. Not many of us do!) ANT stands for Aids to Navigation Teams. They are specialized units responsible for maintaining small buoys, jetty lights, and lighthouses.

Carissa has an equally exciting and busy job staying at home with their children. Abby (age 7) has recently volunteered to do Scripture readings for us on Sundays from time to time. We are always thrilled to have her participate!

DAYS FOR GIRLS INTERNATIONAL

This month we would like to spotlight Days for Girls, an extraordinary organization that is making an impact around the globe.

On the second Monday of each month, Days for Girls Green Bay Chapter, sets up shop in the St. Paul Fellowship hall. People, mainly women (although anyone is welcome) gather to create kits that supply reusable period products for women and girls worldwide.

Days for Girls International began in 2008 when Founder, Celeste Mergens, was working with a foundation in Kenya assisting an orphanage in the outskirts of Nairobi. In the wake of historic post-election violence, the population at the orphanage had swelled from 400 children to 1,400. Upon inquiring about the menstrual health practices of the many girls at the orphanage, Celeste learned that many were sitting on cardboard in their rooms for several days each month – often going without food unless someone would bring it to them. This set into motion her first intervention: disposable pads. But Celeste and her team quickly discovered that without any place to dispose of the pads, this was not a viable or sustainable solution.

It was time for a different plan: a washable, longlasting pad.

Since the first Days for Girls kits, there have been 30 versions of that long-lasting pad and the kits they come in, considering feedback and unique cultural and environmental conditions around the world.

Eventually, Days for Girls developed a health curriculum that aims to provide factual information about puberty & menstruation to break the stigma that exists for many girls and women around the world. The health curriculum is taught to girls, women, and even men to help them better understand that this is a biological process and not a source of shame. Today there are still many girls and women who cannot participate in daily life (missing out on education and other opportunities) because of lack of period products and stigma revolving around menstruation.

Brenda Heller, Title Town Days for Girls Chairperson, says that **since its inception**, **Days for Girls has distributed 3.1 million kits of reusable period products**. While this number **is remarkable, the number of kits necessary to meet the global need is 550 million**. Days for Girls knows it is making a lasting impact, but they also realize there is a long way to go.

Since the Green Bay chapter's official registration in 2014 with Days for Girls, it has produced 12,000 kits, this includes kits that are made at St. Paul.

Each month, we have members from St. Paul, Calvary, and others who are not part of either congregation, gather in the Fellowship Hall to take part in this important work. This month the WOW group from St. Paul presented a check to Days for Girls (see photo).

If you are interested in joining them (no experience is needed) they meet on the second Monday of the month from 1pm-4pm.


