

AUDITION SLATE INSTRUCTIONS

What is a Slate?

A slate is a short introduction included at the beginning (or end) of your self-tape audition. It provides casting with the essential information to quickly identify you. A slate can be done verbally on camera or submitted in writing on screen.

Your slate should include:

- Your full name
- The role you are auditioning for
- Your agent (if applicable) or indicate 'self-represented'

Example – Written Slate (on-screen text):

Jane Smith
Auditioning for: Catherine
Self-Represented

Example – Verbal Slate (to camera):

"Hello, my name is Jane Smith. I'm auditioning for the role of Catherine, and I'm self-represented."
