PILOT DOGS

On February 12th our guest was Jay Gray from Pilot Dogs. He spoke about how Ohio Pilot Dogs has been in existence since 1960. Twenty percent of their annual budget is funded by Ohio Lions. They have 12 dogs placed in Brazil as well. Their puppy program is about 120 dogs per year and is made up of Golden Retrievers, Labs, Boxers, German Shepherds, Dobermans and Standard Poodles. They are continuously looking for people to take puppies to start . They also use 4 Ohio Correctional Facilities where they now have 60 dogs placed. The unit cost for puppies to graduation is \$10.000. There is no cost to the vision impaired person adopting a graduated dog. They are located in Franklin and do dog socializing in German Village. They also have a Hearing Dog Program on a smaller scale with smaller dogs.
