I had hoped to present at one of the last months' scheduled meetings, however the virus situation has made that difficult.

First, I wanted to thank the Norwalk Lion's organization for their "League Champion" donation. In return the Norwalk Lions Club will receive their name on the recognition plaque, their name in the athletic programs for the 2020 season, a 1/4 page ad in the fall and winter programs, and a 10 second ad on the video boards during all high school football games and in the NHS gym during the volleyball and basketball seasons.

Thanks to the support of our local contractors, businesses, civic organizations, and community members many wonderful improvements have/will be made before the scheduled start of the football season. The synthetic field for the football and band members has been put in (both football teams practiced on the field Wednesday August 5th). The new track base has been down for 30 days and the final coat will be administered over the next several days, final striping is schedule later. The new digital scoreboard is scheduled to be put in place the weekend of August 8th.

Additional improvements include: new fencing, walkway around the track,new entrance, additional parking and paving, and concrete work around the home and visitor's locker rooms.


