#### **VISIT TO POLAIR ON FRIDAY 25 JULY 2025**

A large group of our members visited the PolAir organisation located at Bankstown airport. The visit was hosted by Brett Degenhardt, Senior Sergeant Operations Coordinator. It was an excellent experience providing us all with a great understanding of what the PolAir organisation performs for our community. Following is a brief explanation of what we saw on the day.

Polair aircraft, operated by NSW Police, are equipped with a variety of specialized technology



for law enforcement and emergency operations. These include high-definition video cameras, Forward Looking Infra-Red (FLIR) systems, powerful searchlights (like the NiteSun), rescue winches, and GPS navigation systems. They also utilize digital radio systems and can downlink live video feeds to ground stations.

## Here's a more detailed breakdown:



#### Surveillance and Reconnaissance:

FLIR (Forward Looking Infra-Red) cameras and high-definition video cameras allow for surveillance and observation, day or night, in various weather conditions.

#### Search and Rescue:

Rescue winches are essential for rescuing individuals in remote or difficult-to-access locations.

#### Navigation:

GPS navigation systems ensure accurate flight paths and help locate people or objects during searches.

#### Lighting:

High-powered searchlights, like the <u>NiteSun</u>, illuminate areas for search and rescue operations or to assist in locating suspects.

#### Communication:

Digital radio systems facilitate communication between the aircraft and ground units, while the ability to downlink live video allows for real-time information sharing.

#### Specialized Aircraft:

Polair aircraft include both helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft, each equipped with tailored technology for their specific roles. For example, PolAir 4, an EC135 P2+, is equipped with a FLIR camera, NiteSun searchlight, and a two-person winch.

#### Training:

NSW Police Aviation Command utilizes simulators, including a winch simulator, to train crews on specialized equipment and procedures, ensuring safety and proficiency.









