Please take the time, therefore, to read our assessments and add your own notes where appropriate. We emphasise to every group the importance of thorough hand-washing when handling animals and we advise all students to have taken all hygienic precautions after stroking/caring for the animals.

School hygiene	Farm animal hygiene – animal droppings and urinating	Staff, students, including vulnerabl e people	Our animals are trained not to relieve themselves indoors. As with all animals this is sometimes unavoidable. We will clean up after our animals and remove all solid waste. However the school is responsible for disinfecting in accordance with their own cleaning protocol.	Staff are reminded that they are responsible for the supervision of their students and they should keep away whilst any clean up activities are in place. Staff should ensure all cleaning is done to their high standards.	
Animal petting	Being kicked by an alpaca, being knocked over by an alpaca	Staff, students, including vulnerabl e people	All persons stoking any animal will be shown how to handle the animals and how to avoid accidents. All persons will be supervised at all times and will never be left unaccompanied. In the unlikely event of either owner having to leave the scene for a few moments due to an emergency situation the student will be asked to remove themselves from the animal or left in the care of a member of staff who feels confident in the handling of the animal, if they agree this is appropriate and safe to do so.
