Continuing Business:

Peshtigo National Bank

Our CD is maturing on November 9th at Peshtigo National Bank. Its interest rate is 4%. Do we want to roll it over or cash it in?

Associated Bank is offering 3.5% in their MM savings account if the balance is over 10K. That rate is locked in for six months. **The group agreed we don't anticipate any costs (other than the last pheasant payment). We can transfer money into the banquet account once we get closer the fall.**

What should we do with our maturing CD? **Group asked if Terre could check on the interest rate. It was agreed if 4% or close to roll over.**

Dumpster bins will again be placed out in the county for deer carcass collection to reduce the spread of CWD. Last year over 51 tons were collected. **Richard Clark and Terre Radtke attended, Richard let us know on the dumpsters the DNR will be posting at various locations.**

Deer Hide Donation Boxes

We will again we sponsoring deer hide collection boxes at 515 gas station (formerly G3) and The Junction gas station. For the 2026 gun deer season we have purchased four banners from Vital Signs to better advertise our donation boxes. Two signs will be placed at the two locations. Each sign was \$40.



James Benzing will monitor the collection box at 515 gas station. Owen Morgan will be depositing his capes at The Junction gas station. Tyler Readman will collect all hides placed in this box. Richard and Maryann Clark will collect donations at their residence once again. John Gregory suggested possibly putting out the boxes earlier to catch late season bow hunters? We need to determine a date to place the boxes out. Terre Radtke will handle hanging the banners. **Richard Brazeau is willing to place the 3rd hide donation box outside of his gun shop. Richard Clark recommends checking boxes every night at 515 and the junction to help stop thievery.**
