Pastor's Corner



November begins a season of giving and being thankful. At the heart of Christian living and worship is gratitude. We are grateful because God has given us so much—and much more than we can ever repay. First, God has given us life itself. Some people are not happy in life; but one Presbyterian elder says that one thing that brings him happiness is his commitment to tithe. He writes, “It is glorious to have that comforting feeling that we are doing God’s will in a matter so vital as our money making—to know that our tithe, be it large or small, is helping to advance the cause of Christ—to feel that we are really in partnership with God.” (from “I Tithe, Testimonials from Nine Laypersons”).

Second, God has given us the promise of abundant life that has overcome even death itself. God wants us to go after our dreams in life, to live fulfilled lives. We experience pitfalls, tragedy and failure along the way; but the final victory is won in Jesus Christ our Lord. God wants us to live with joy, and we are blessed that today we have so many resources that previous generations did not have—counseling, medication, superior medical treatment, a better understanding and acceptance of mental illness. God wants us to use these resources to help us if we need them so that we may live with confidence and joy.

Third, God has given us a mission in life—a mission that every human being shares. That mission is to show the love of God in all that we do—as I just preached, to follow the Greatest Commandment that Jesus gives us: *Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind and soul; and Love your neighbor as yourself.* When we make this commandment our goal in life, it does not mean life will be easy. In fact, in some ways it may be harder because our culture does not always appreciate those who seek to love above all else. But God will bless us richly when we love God and our neighbor (as well as ourselves!). God will help us as we strive to love sacrificially, as we seek to live as Jesus did. What greater blessing is that—to know that God is by our side guiding us?

You know the story of the ten lepers that Jesus healed, found in Luke 17:11-19. Ten were healed of their leprosy, but only one of them came back to give thanks—and he was a Samaritan! Jesus commented, “Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?” It is striking that it was the foreigner who returned and gave thanks. We are among the nine, but we can return and give thanks, and show our gratitude to God through our commitment to Christ’s church and through our giving of our talents, time and money. I hope you will join me in this season of gratitude, and be generous in giving thanks to God for all that God has given us.

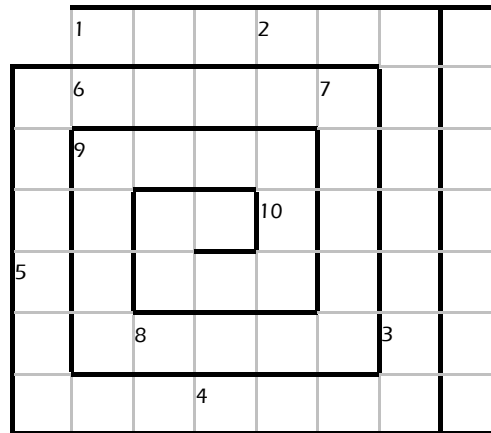
