#### **Pastor's Corner**

We continue to live in strange times. One thing I want to address is that I've heard some say, "Why did God give us the coronavirus? What is God trying to tell us?" First of all, God is love, and God's nature is of the suffering, sacrificial love revealed in Jesus Christ. God would never bring such a virus upon a world that God created and called good and very good. Second, the question we must ask ourselves is how have we brought about or made worse the presence of this virus? Global warming, unhealthy relationships with other nations, inept organization and a poor response to the virus, and a lack of concern for "the least of these" among us have all contributed to its presence among us.

And it worries me to no end that people do not seem to realize that the virus is really just hitting our area. People do not seem to be as vigilant about wearing masks, gloves and keeping social distances. We are now seeing in states like Florida, Georgia and Texas how "opening" has led to record number of cases in their states. We certainly do not want this to happen in South Dakota or Meade County. I applaud our Session's wisdom in taking this virus seriously.

We can look at this time as a great opportunity, even though it is a more difficult period. We have witnessed some incredible beginnings hopefully to changes in our society that should have been made long ago. The recognition of how much racism there is in our culture is hopefully something we've all seen in the terrible and tragic death of George Floyd. And we have learned about the unjust deaths of so many more—too many—black men and women. Is this the kind of society we want in America? Surely not, and surely God is calling us to something better. We must confront the bigotry in our own hearts first, and then move to eradicate its effects in the world around us. God calls us to repentance and to renewal in our world.

I've asked the Session to join me in a study of "White Privilege," which is one session in a series on racism put out by our denomination. We will look at it at our next stated meeting. By doing so, hopefully we will learn something about ourselves and how we might act differently. We may also see how our church needs to respond in our community and world to injustice around us. Remember that injustice anywhere affects and limits the freedom we all enjoy; and the church has a special calling to stand up for any who suffer from injustice's effects.
