Speakers: Ann Perez, Principal of Temple Terrace Elementary School (Tigers)

Laura Grucza, Resource Manager, Hillsborough Education Foundation

Perez - The school welcomes any volunteers as they have no PTA. 624 students, 26 school days left this term, children wear uniforms. Activities include grandparents read-in, weekend food pantry. Participate in Temple Terrace Reads, Great American Teach-in on Nov. 17, Family Math night at Publix. Big participant in Relay for Life.

**Needs:** Picture Day volunteers, Terrific Tiger Sponsors, uniforms, school clinic supplies, student incentives, school supplies for students. Need prizes and assistance for Family Bingo night. School theme for this year is "Be Kind".

Grucza - Foundation was founded in 1988 by organizations that wanted to help schools in our district, 270 schools. Provides grants to teachers to fund special projects, mentoring and scholarships, Teaching Tools Store for Title 1 teachers who can shop free. Other teachers can provide volunteer hours to pay for their shopping. On target for \$3.5 million distribution this year. Help is provided to 162 schools, college readiness programs, Take Stock in children which funds a 2 year community college scholarship.
