

A mother at 100 years old; beautiful in appearance that King Abimelek sent for her. God intervened.


SARAH

JACOB, A MIRROR OF THE OVERCOMERS




LEAH LONGED FOR HER HUSBAND'S LOVE


JOSEPH



David


JESUS, SON OF DAVID

He will rise with healing in his wings.





NAAMAN HEALED OF LEPROSY

LIKE THE PRODIGAL SON, THE DIVORCED HOUSE RETURNED TO THE FATHER

Naaman was gentile general. Unique to him was the help he received from the God of Israel to give victory to Aram. "Now Naaman was a commander of the army of the king of Aram. He was a great man in the sight of his master and highly regarded, because through him the LORD had given victory to Aram. He was a valiant soldier, but he had leprosy" (II Kings 5:1). Naaman's relationship with the God of Israel was due to him remembering his roots. He was a general from the divorced house of Israel. This becomes evident from the gifts he brings to Elijah when he came for healing. God divorced this house because they were determined to chase their craving for superpower status and wealth. They wanted to be like the nations who worshipped rebel gods, whose kingdoms, like Egypt, were grand, great and glorious. God wanted His people to live humbly, serving Him in His royal priesthood. The house of Israel rebelled and God divorced them, allowing them to rule as they pleased and live according to what they considered to be right and good.

WOMAN HEALED OF <u>A</u> ISSUE OF BLOOD


The woman with an issue of blood

THE TEN TRIBES' CHURCH OF ISRAEL WAS HEALED

This woman with an issue of blood for 12 years mirrored the story of the repentant 10-tribed church of Israel. Her bleeding condition is an image of loss of life. The ministry of the pagan 10-tribed church of Israel was unable to conceive and birth a spiritually healthy congregation.

This woman, like the church of the ten tribes of Israel, searched and exhausted all resources for healing. When she heard that Jesus was coming, she turned to him. She remembered her ancestors and their ancient Hebrew teachings and knew by merely touching the corner of his tallit, it would communicate her repentance and desire to remember and keep God's commandments. Jesus felt power leave him to flow into the woman now committed to obeying God and he healed her.

"But for you who fear My name, the sun of righteousness [Christ] will rise with healing in its wings [kanaph—the corners of the tallit]" (Malachi 4:2).

THE CHURCH OF ISRAEL REDEEMED

Nowhere in John 4 is the description of the woman at the well as a prostitute. She was a woman who married five times and was divorced five times, leaving her destitute to live with a man, likely a relative who was willing to take her in. Women were rarely in a position to take care of themselves in those days.

For hundreds of years, the church of the ten tribes of Israel flirted with and engaged in false religion. This church imaged the woman at the well, who too, was infertile. Used and discarded by the gods, this church repented and sought to return to their Hebrew God. They learned of their Saviour and patiently they waited for his arrival.

Then, one day Jesus arrived at the well, built by Jacob many centuries earlier. She acknowledged that they were both from the tribes of Israel. Jesus, a Jew from the house of Judah and the woman, also a descendant from Jacob, likely from the house of Joseph.

THE OFFER OF GOD'S HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus introduced the woman to the gift of God's Holy Spirit and the change from a physical church to the spiritual church, but before he could offer it to her, he addressed her many relationships. The reason was to ensure her sincerity. The church of the ten tribes had a long history of vowing to remain faithful, but was rarely fully committed. The woman at the well immediately acknowledged Jesus as a prophet, someone who had direct communication with God. She did not hide her failed relationships, instead these fallen relationships had brought her to seek a saviour. Jesus said that he was that saviour and she immediately believed him because he proved himself to have information that only a prophet could know. This woman mirrored the faith of the church of the ten tribes of Israel. Jesus was commissioned by God to save them and bring them back into the covenant family.

The house of Israel—the 10-tribes acknowledged Jesus immediately as their Messiah of the world. It was around noon, 6 hours before sunset. At that same time, but on a different day, Pilate said to the Jews, **"Behold your King!**" (John 19:14) The Jews rejected Jesus as their Messiah around the 6th hour at the same time, different day, that the church of the ten tribes accepted Jesus as their Messiah. God's timing is impeccable. He will rise with healing in his wings.

THE JEWISH CHURCH WILL BE HEALED BY JESUS CHRIST AT THE BEGINNING OF HIS MILLENNIAL REIGN

The woman bent over for eighteen years is a vivid illustration for 21st century Judo-Christians of the crumpled state of the Jewish church. The Jewish priesthood will be healed by Jesus Christ, the one they rejected, at the beginning of his Millennial reign—on the Sabbath. The condition of the woman bent over mirrors the greater story of the Jewish church that within a 24-hour period being a full day—period of time, three-quarters of that time, they have been crippled from the heavy burdens placed on them by their religious leaders.



Through Abraham, God chose a people to become a royal priesthood and holy nation.

Rebekah learned that her twins will become two covenant people where one would grow spiritually stronger than the other. This is mirrored in the latter-day saints with God's Holy Spirit, they will outperform rebellious ancient Israel. Rachel is a mirror of the church God loves. She died before she saw her children and yet, she weeps bitterly fearing for their safety. The fallen house of Israel was divorced but through the lives of Naaman, the woman with an issue of blood and the woman at the well, God preserved their healing and return to the covenant family. The Jewish church will be freed of the burdens illegitimately placed on them at the beginning of the Millennium. Jesus Christ is instrumental in the healing of God's people. He is their Saviour and the leader for all of mankind to follow wherever he goes.
