Dear Joseph,

We communicate in the blink of an eye. We live in comfort under regulated heating and cooling systems. We go on holidays. Some of us have boats and holidays homes—and there's lots and lots of us, your descendants. We are in the millions!

The descendants of your son, Ephraim revelled in wealth and power as a world super-power for about 250 years. The sun never set on their empire because they had people scattered over many countries all over the world. Manasseh shared in their wealth for awhile, but *our* God, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob pulled them out and gave them their own land. There was a battle, but God prevailed. They too, have enjoyed riches of wealth, land, resources, and power.

Should I say?

Umm... I feel a need to apologize. Umm... In bitter disappointment, I tell you that Ephraim and Manasseh have failed you and worse still, our God and—your mother weeps— "A voice is heard in Ramah, mourning and great weeping. Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted because her children are no more" (Jeremiah 31:15). Joseph, please don't worry. I know I have upset you, but things will work out—eventually. You see this is what the Lord says, "Restrain your voice from weeping and your eyes from tears, for your work will be rewarded. They will return from the land of the enemy. So there is hope for your future. Your children will return to the land" (Jeremiah 16:17).



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It is a long story filled with anger, jealousy, disobedience and revenge. Ephraim was at one time well respected by God and his brothers. "When Ephraim spoke, men trembled; he was exalted in Israel. But he became guilty of Baal worship and died. Now they sin more and more—" (Hosea 13:1-2).

Where do I begin?

I know you loved your people that's why you asked that after you die, your bones travel with them out of Egypt and into that 40 year stay in the desert before arriving in the Promised land. You could have been buried with your father, Jacob, but you chose to stay in Egypt and travel with them—as if in spirit.
