No Israel, No Kingdom for Us

"O God, do not keep silent;
be not quiet, O God, be not still.

See how your enemies are astir,
how your foes rear their heads.

With cunning they conspire against your people;
They plot against those you cherish.

'Come,' they say, 'let us destroy them as a nation,
that the name of Israel be remembered no more.'"

Psalm 83:1-4

The rebellious sons of God—princes and rulers in the heavenly realm and heavenly powers of this dark world, have worked to destroy the nation of Israel—the twelves tribes of Israel, since their birth when God announced that they are His inheritance—His first-born.

The rogue sons of God know the general plan of God, but there are secrets kept from them. Through the kingdom of Israel, God will lead all the nations back to Him. They are his kingdom of royal priests, a holy nation. The descendants of Israel have been a failure for over 3,000 years. The evil rulers and authorities delight in Israel's failure and they continue to think that they will win, but they are wrong. Israel along with the rest of the world have been redeemed. Israel will repent during Jacob's trouble and the survivors will return home and re-establish a united kingdom of changed, humble, God fearing, and God serving people—the least of all nations.

ISRAEL IS GOD'S INHERITANCE: "Let **us** confuse their language and scatter them," God ordered. "I will establish the boundaries for these peoples according to the sons of God [70 sons]. **I will set aside land for My inheritance and My people.** The nations will **not** be my inheritance, I will give them over to the sons of God (Deuteronomy 32:8), but **Jacob** will be **MY** inheritance/allotment" (Deuteronomy 4:19-20).

THEY WILL REPENT: Moses wrote, "When you are in distress and all these things have come upon you, in the latter days you will return to the Lord your God and listen to His voice" (Deuteronomy 4:30).

"These are the words concerning Israel (the northern house – 10 tribes) and Judah (the southern house – 2 tribes)... How awful that day will be! No other will be like it. It will be a time of trouble for Jacob, but he will be saved out of it [Note: 'saved' means that they will repent and be saved spiritually]" (Jeremiah 30:4,7).

"In those days, at that time, the **people of Israel** and the **people of Judah together** will go **in tears to seek the Yahuah, their God**. They will ask the way of Zion and turn their faces toward it. They will come and bind themselves to the Lord in an **everlasting covenant** that will not be forgotten (Jeremiah 50:4-5).

"From that day forward the **house of Israel** will know that I am Yahuah, their God. And the nations will know that the people of Israel **went into exile for their sin, because they were unfaithful to me**. So I hid my face from them and handed them over to their enemies, and **they all** [all who were destined to die by the sword] **fell by the sword**. I dealt with them according to their uncleanness and their offenses, and I hid my face from them" (Ezekiel 39:22-24).

"An unheard-of disaster is coming... I am about to pour out my wrath on you and spend my anger against you; I will judge you according to your conduct and repay you for all of your detestable practices... though you blow the trumpet and get everything ready, no one will go into battle, for my wrath is upon the whole crowd... Outside is the sword, inside are the plague and famine; those in the country will die by the sword..." (Ezekiel 7:5-15).

SURVIVORS WILL RETURN HOME: "At that time, I will gather you; at that time, I will bring you home. I will give you honor and praise among all the peoples of the earth when I restore your fortunes before your very eyes" (Zephaniah 3:20).

"When ye be multiplied and increased in the land in those days...the house of Judah shall walk with the house of Israel and they shall come together out of the land of the north, to the land that I gave for an inheritance unto your Fathers" (Jeremiah 3:16-18).

"Therefore say: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: I will gather you from the nations and bring you back from the countries where you have been scattered, and I will give you back the land of Israel AGAIN'" (Ezekiel 11:17).

THE ANCIENT KINGDOM OF ISRAEL WILL BE RE-UNITED: "I am going to take the stick of Joseph—which is in the hand of Ephraim and the Israelite tribes associated with him and the stick of Judah and the Israelite tribes associated with him and join them, making them a single stick of wood...I will take the Israelites out of the nations where they have gone. I will gather them from all around and bring them back into their own land. I will make them ONE nation in the land... there will be ONE king over all of them and they will never again be two nations or be divided into two kingdoms" (Ezekiel 37:18-22).

"Those who survived the sword found grace in the wilderness; when Israel sought for rest, the Lord appeared to him from far away. I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore, I have continued my faithfulness to you. Again I will build you, and you shall be built, O virgin Israel!" (Jeremiah 31:1-4)

"Ephraim will be like a mighty man, and their heart will be glad as if from wine; Indeed, their children will see it and be glad, their heart will rejoice in the LORD. I will whistle for them to gather them together, For I have redeemed them; And they will be as numerous as they were

before. When I scatter them among the peoples, they will remember Me in far countries, and they with their children will live and come back" (Zechariah 10:8-10).

GOG AND HIS HORDES WILL ATTACK ISRAEL:

Many Christians believe that Gog is ancient imagery for a physical nation on earth, but scriptures describe Gog as a CHIEF PRINCE ruling in the far north. All of man's enemies are rogue heavenly powers who reside in heaven. Gog, is likely the last remaining rogue son of God ruling over his heavenly territory called Meshech and Tubal, who will be called to battle against God at the end of the Millennium—the last battle that will clean up heaven and earth from wicked, rebellious creation.

"O Gog, chief prince of Meshech and Tubal... on that day thoughts will come into your mind and you will devise an evil scheme. You will say, 'I will invade a land of unwalled villages; I will attack a peaceful and unsuspecting people—all of them living without walls and without gates and bars. I will plunder and loot and turn my hand against the resettled ruins and the people gathered from the nations, rich in livestock and goods, living at the center of the land... You will come from your place in the FAR NORTH, you and many nations with you, all of them riding o horses, a great horde, a mighty army" (Ezekiel 38:10-15).

After 1,000 years when the nation of Israel has long recovered from wars and wickedness, they will be attacked by Gog and Magog. "When the thousand years are over, **Satan will be released from his prison** and will go out to deceive the nations in the four corners of the earth, **Gog and Magog**, to gather them for battle" (Revelation 20:7-8).

THE ATTACK WILL FAIL: The motley crew of the fallen won't give up. Their plan is to **completely destroy the nation of Israel,** the seed that is **destined to bring ALL of the nations back to God**. For over 3,000 years, they succeeded in luring the 12 tribes of Israel into sin, but God's redemptive plan has provided a way for forgiveness and evil is being overthrown and soon it will be destroyed but **not without a fight**.

After many days, the book of Revelation refers to this time as after 1,000 years, when Israel is a re-united people in the land of their forefathers. They appear vulnerable and their wealth does not go unnoticed. The next stage in God's plan is to confront still another enemy—Gog and Magog. He calls Gog to war. Gog responds bringing with him a horde of people from many nations and their intent is the total destruction of Israel and to plunder their wealth. This attack fails because God's jealous love for His people ignites His raw power. The nations watch and learn that God has made Israel holy and that He will not tolerate rebellion. It becomes very clear to them why God dealt harshly with Israel previously—for their unfaithfulness. The nations witness the total destruction of Gog and his hordes and they seek to know God. Gog and his hordes are buried in Israel in the valley called the Valley of Hamon Gog.

"The Sovereign Lord says: I am against you, O Gog... I will bring you from the far north and send you against the mountains of Israel. Then I will strike your bow from your left hand and make your arrows drop from your right hand. On the mountains of Israel, you will fall, you and all your troops and the nations with you" (Ezekiel 38:2-4).

"I will display my glory among the nations, and all the nations will see the punishment I inflict and the hand I lay upon them" (Ezekiel 39:21).

THE WORLD LEARNS WHY ISRAEL WAS SENT INTO CAPTIVITY A SECOND TIME: "And the nations will know that the people of Israel went into exile for their sin, because they were unfaithful to me. So I hid my face from them and handed them over to their enemies, and they all fell by the sword. I dealt with them according to their uncleanness and their offenses, and I hid my face from them" (Ezekiel 39:23-24).

THE NATIONS LEARN THAT THE GOD OF ISRAEL IS THE HOLY ONE IN ISRAEL: "I will make known my holy name among my people Israel. I will no longer let my holy name be profaned, and the nations will know that I the Lord am the Holy One in Israel" (Ezekiel 39:7).

"When I have brought them back from the nations and have gathered them from the countries of their enemies, I will show myself holy through them in the sight of many nations. Then they will know that I am the Lord their God, for though I sent them into exile among the nations, I will gather them to their own land, not leaving any behind. I will no longer hide my face from them, for I will pour out my Spirit on the house of Israel, declares the Sovereign Lord" (Ezekiel 39:27-29).

"I will show my greatness and my holiness, and I will make myself known in the sight of many nations. Then they will know that I am the Lord" (Ezekiel 38:23).

"It is too small a thing that you should be My servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the preserved ones of Israel; I will also make you a light of the nations so that My salvation may reach to the end of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6).

"My dwelling place will be with them; I will be their God, and they will be my people. Then the nations will know that I the Lord make Israel holy, when my sanctuary is among them forever" (Ezekiel 37:27-28).

GOD'S KINGDOM WILL GROW TO COVER THE WHOLE EARTH: The nations of the world will repent and enter into God's Kingdom, which will grow to cover the whole earth—returning to the original one family at creation.

"In the time of those kings, the **God of heaven will set up a kingdom that will never be destroyed**, nor will it be left to another people. **It will crush all those kingdoms** and bring them to an end, but **it will itself endure forever**" (Daniel 2:44).

"The rock that struck the statue **became a huge mountain and filled the whole earth**" (Daniel 2:35).

"They will not hurt or destroy in all My holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea" (Isaiah 11:9).

"All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations will worship before You" (Psalm 22:27).

GOD WILL RULE OVER ALL AND THROUGH ALL: Christ will overthrow wickedness and bring an end to death, for obedience to God will be the people's choice. Then, Christ will bend his knee to his Father and God will rule over all and through all. Mankind will be made glorious like Christ, then, God will bring his ruling throne down and live among men. He will create a new heaven and new earth suitable for his eternal royal, ruling family and their realms will unite under a monarchy: Christ as king from the realm in heaven and the saints/the bride as queen from the realm on earth.

"He who overcomes will inherit all this, and I will be his God and he will be my son" (Revelation 21:7).

"For he [Christ] must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death. For he 'has put everything under his feet.' Now when it says that 'everything' has been put under him, it is clear that this does not include God himself, who put everything under Christ. When he has done this, then the Son himself will be made subject to him who put everything under him, so that God may be all in all" (I Corinthians 15:25-28).

"And the LORD [God Almighty] will be king over all the earth; in that day the LORD will be the only one, and His name the only one" (Zechariah 14:9).

"Then I saw a **new heaven and a new earth**, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the **new Jerusalem**, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a **bride beautifully dressed for her husband**. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'Now **the dwelling of God is with men**, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God'" (Revelation 21:1-3).
