## The story of Cain



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Cain was the firstborn child from Adam and Eve (Genesis 4:1). It appears they were trying to conceive, but it took "help" from God; He had to open Eve's womb. Had they not sinned, conception would have been easy, but already the curse of sin was at work.

God is teaching His people, through the difficulty of conception, that now, His church would have difficulty conceiving and birthing a righteous congregation fit for God's kingdom and only through God's "help"—that is, the receiving of God's Holy Spirit, would the church—specifically the ministry—be successful.

Cain was not altogether living God's way. God said, "If you do what is right, will you not be accepted?" (Genesis 4:7). The firstborn son of Adam and Eve was pulling away from God to live according to what he thought was right. Cain understood the purpose of giving offerings to God, but he was compromising and white-washing sin. It was evident in his offering that the produce was not the best of his harvest.

## There are five categories of offerings with three options:

- 1. Burnt offering: of the herd, flock, fowl
- 2. Grain offering: burnt on the altar, baked or cooked on a griddle
- 3. Sin and 4. Guilt offering: of the herd, flock, fowl
- **5. Fellowship offering:** of the herd, flock, fowl

The three options provide a means for every person in any situation to come before God with an offering that is acceptable to Him.

The instructions for each offering comprise of many steps that require careful attention. If the burnt offering was from the herd, they were to choose a young bull without defect. If it was from the flock, a male sheep without defect was offered or goat without defect. If it was a burnt offering of birds, then a dove or young pigeon was offered. They were required to kill the sacrifice in a specific way at a specific location. The grain offerings were made from the finest flour without yeast and oil that was either burnt, baked or prepared on a griddle.

The Old Testament sacrifices bring sin to the forefront of everyday life. It is a reminder of the penalty and payment that satisfies our Creator. The fellowship offering is a type of invitation from the offeror to our Father in heaven that is a welcoming communion, desiring to grow a relationship of unity. While these sacrifices could not pay the penalty of the sins of the people, they were a foreshadow of things to come described throughout the pages of the New Testament of the One who can and does pay the penalty.

Abel's offering to God was very specific; he was intentionally sending a clear message. He brought the "fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock" (Genesis 4:4). Abel was demonstrating to God his faith that despite sin was then and now part of this world on earth, from out of Adam and Eve, there will be righteous people who will be resurrected or transformed in the first resurrection as members of God's holy, royal, ruling family. He believed that he would be one of them. His faith was recorded by the Apostle Paul in Hebrews, "By faith Abel offered God a better sacrifice than Cain did. By faith he was commended as a righteous man, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith he still speaks, even though he is dead" (Hebrews 11:4).

Abel's burnt offering acknowledged the awareness of sin, the penalty and need for a Saviour. Cain offered a grain offering, which is an acceptable offering to God, but what Cain brought was not the best of his harvest. He did not esteem the great Creator. His offering was more an obligation than a gift to please the One who is utterly revered. Satan likes to promote the inevitability of sin. Compromise is his solution for mistakes and white-washing the hurdle to release feelings of guilt.

Cain resented God's favour towards Abel and he lured him away from his flocks into his field—his territory where his way rules—there he killed him.

The first son of Adam and Eve became a murderer. The spiritual story of mankind unfolds in the lives of people and the must-know lessons are preserved in the Bible. God Almighty is the Alpha and the Omega, He knew the end before the beginning. The firstborn son died spiritually; he mirrors the death of all those who will die spiritually when they refuse to repent and accept the sacrifice of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. A superficial relationship with God will not save mankind.

God punished Cain and said, "When you work the ground, it will no longer yield its crops for you. You will be a restless wanderer on the earth" (Genesis 4:12). Like an emotionally-driven child, Cain responded. "My punishment is more than I can bear. Today you are driving me from the land, and I will be hidden from your presence; I will be a restless wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me" (Genesis 4:13-14). Still, no repentance from Cain. Cain provides additional details of his punishment. God relocated him outside of Eden. God engineered spiritual revelations in the four directions: north, south, east and west.

• **East** is the place of holiness. God's temple is located in the east. The wise and righteous men who gave gifts to baby Jesus came from the east. The east wind is the mighty power of God who pushed His ungodly people away from Him.

- West is the place of unholiness. It is the location of those who have a long history of rebelling against God. The ten tribes of Israel were pushed by the east wind westward populating western Europe and the lands in all the West.
- North is the place of God's throne, His holy courts where His law is enforced.
- **South** is the place of lawlessness. Deep south, inside the earth is the prison of the captured fallen sons of God. Described by Ezekiel as the Pit.

Cain cries, "whoever finds me will kill me." Cain is very much aware of the population growth that will take place in his lifetime. His father, Adam, lived 960 years. Cain's sins were known among the family. His sisters all knew. Cain was Adam and Eve's first son and Abel their second son, but not mentioned but known, were daughters born from Adam and Eve. Cain married one of his sisters. Cain knew the murder of their brother brought his sisters intense sadness and contempt towards him. He knew soon more brothers would be born and over hundreds of years families, tribes, houses and nations would rise within the Adam family. He was afraid.

God said, "Not so, if anyone kills Cain, he will suffer vengeance seven times over" (Genesis 4:15). It is not for mankind to take vengeance. The Apostle Paul quoted Almighty God, "For we know Him who said, 'Vengeance is Mine; I will repay,' and again, 'The Lord will judge His people'" (Hebrews 10:30).

"So Cain went out from the LORD's presence and lived in the land of Nod, east of Eden" (Genesis 4:16). The word "east" can also be translated "in front of" Eden.

"The geographical situation of the land of Nod, in the front of Eden (קדמת, see Genesis 2:14), where Cain settled after his departure from the place or the land of the revealed presence of God (cf. Jonah 1:3), cannot be determined. The name Nod denotes a land of flight and banishment, in contrast with Eden, the land of delight, where Jehovah walked with men." (Keil and Delitzsch <a href="https://biblehub.com/commentaries/genesis/4-16.htm">https://biblehub.com/commentaries/genesis/4-16.htm</a>)

Cain did not recognize or did his family recognize God's good grace and long-suffering by protecting him from being killed for what he did. God's good grace and long-suffering continues now 6,000 years later as God watches one crime after another.

Lamech, Cain's great, great grandson killed a man for wounding him (Genesis 4:23). This barbaric man callously cleared himself of wrongdoing by stating, "If Cain is avenged seven times, then Lamech seventy-seven times" (Genesis 4:24). Cain was protected by God to live safely throughout his lifetime symbolized in the numerical expression "seven times". Lamech's use of seventy-seven times is not a random pick of numbers, but an understanding of God's use of numbers and the prophecy associated with it. Seventy is the number that "signifies perfect spiritual order," states E. W. Bullinger.

"Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, until seventy times seven" (Matthew 18:21-22). Jesus was emphasizing the importance of the act of

continually forgiving your fellow man and woman. When God's perfect spiritual order is established, then the resurrected saints will judge the world. "Don't you realize that someday we believers will judge the world? And since you are going to judge the world, can't you decide even these little things among yourselves?" (I Corinthians 6:2)

Lamech awarded himself grace without repentance.

Daniel recorded instructions from God through the Archangel Gabriel. It was a seventy 'seven' decree given to His people. It marks the end of sin and the establishment of perfect spiritual order.

"Seventy 'sevens' decreed for God's people and the holy city to finish transgression, end sin, atone for wickedness, bring in everlasting righteousness, uncover prophecy and anoint the most holy" (Daniel 9:24). Perfect spiritual order will come at the end of seventy-sevens. Lamech's statement reveals an understanding of this prophecy, but he added his own twist by removing repentance. He declared himself safe. His attitude did not show remorse for the murder he committed, rather an allowance to continue in sin until God's perfect spiritual order is established.



It was not the firstborn son that would lead the way into righteousness. Abel, had he lived a full lifetime, would have been the son to fulfill the role of the firstborn. Adam's family lacked righteousness until Seth was born. Eve was happy and said, "God has granted me another child in place of Abel, since Cain killed him" (Genesis 4:25). She was yearning for righteous leaders. God added, "Seth also had a son, and he named him Enosh. At that time men began to call on the name of the LORD" (Genesis 4:26). Finally, people began desiring to live righteously.

The story of Cain began with an offering to God. Our loving Saviour has paid the price for our sins. God has paved the way for believers to be the more excellent offering.

"For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins. Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, 'Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me'" (Hebrews 10:4-5).

Judo-Christians perpetually offer God donations or tithes, time, devotion, study, obedience, and reverence. The question every Judo-Christian should ask is whether their offering is a more excellent offering because only the more excellent offerings demonstrate true and lasting devotion, faithfulness and obedience to our LORD, our Father in heaven whom we love with all our heart, mind, soul and strength. Anything else is unacceptable.





The Old Testament sacrifices taught us that sin is detestable, deplorable and punishable only through death. The sacrifices of animals without defect mirrored the perfect sacrifice to come. This sacrifice was accepted and it rent the veil between man and God to open the way into eternal life. The walk for believers is laid out in the construction and components of the wilderness tabernacle.

The inability to conceive is a spiritual image of the ministry to establish a church and birth a righteous congregation when sin is running rampant in this evil age. The LORD was revealing the spiritual story of the church through Eve. The Freemasons preach a twisted story of Cain.

Also, it should be noted at this time, that when Cain feared for his life and God protected him by marking him. It was not because there already existed other beings from a different species living on earth with God's new creation from Adam and Eve. Adam lived 960 years. Cain knew that during his lifetime, more brothers and sisters would be born and his existing sisters would tell the story of the murder of their beloved brother, Abel. Cain feared the vengeance of his own brothers and their families in the future.

The belief that other forms on earth existed at the same time of Adam and Eve and their children is a misnomer. All statements reducing Eve to the position of a prostitute or an adulteress is shameful. Eve was deceived in the same way that all of mankind is deceived. Adam was not deceived. He accepted what Eve passed onto him because he desired it, knowing it was wrong.

"Nevertheless, death reigned from Adam until Moses, even over those who had not sinned in the likeness of the offense of Adam, who is a type of Him who was to come" (Romans 5:14).

Adam's sin is specific. "But they [the house of Israel—10 tribes], **like Adam**, have **transgressed the covenant**; there they were **unfaithful to Me**" (Hosea 6:7).

Adam's sin was of the same type as the fallen house of Israel, specially the ten tribes of Israel who were divorced by God. They wanted to be like the nations around them whose kingdoms were grand and stature strong. The leaders of the ten tribes of Israel wanted to rule themselves so that they could self-direct and acquire superpower status, flaunt a massive army and push their influence across the whole world. They wanted an empire that was visually glorious with tall temples and government houses, vast jurisdictions and riches lavished with prestige.

Serving and worshipping a fallen heavenly ruler instead of their God was acceptable to them in order to get what they craved. That is what the sin of Adam was—to worship Satan—to gain self-glory, power and lavish authority.

Jesus Christ is the Word. His perfect understanding of God's way keeps him from falling into deception. Mankind is born without knowledge; mankind grows in grace and knowledge. Even babes in Christ have not matured to distinguish between right and wrong.

"Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is **not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness.** But **solid food is for the mature**, who by constant use have **trained themselves to distinguish good from evil**" (Hebrews 5:13-14). Satan knew Eve was still a babe in Christ, unable to distinguish between good and evil.

Immature Judo-Christians often lean on their own understanding, as Eve did. They honestly think their way is right, until the consequences occur and they regret their actions.

"There is a way that appears to be right, but in the end, it leads to death" (Proverbs 14:12).

"What fruit did you reap at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? The outcome of those things is death" (Romans 6:21).

It is appropriate at this time that the discussion open to assess the Christian theory that the sons of God in Genesis 6 were the sons of Seth who are thought to have intermarried with the daughters of Cain to produce the Nephilim. This is another misnomer for the following reasons:

- God said that after Seth was born and he had a son Enosh, people then began to call on the name of the LORD (Genesis 4:26). Calling on the name of LORD means that they began worshipping Him and living His way. If the sons of Seth mingled with the daughters of Cain, they and their "Nephilim" offspring would not be calling on the name of the LORD.
- The sons of Seth mingling with the daughters of Cain could not produce offspring so tall
  to be considered a super race of people—men of renown, different from the norms of
  Adam and Eve.
- In the New Testament, Jesus corrects the Sadducees in regard to marriage after the resurrection. "At the resurrection people will neither marry nor be given in marriage; they will be like the angels in heaven" (Matthew 22:30). The angels who left their places in heaven and went down to earth, can manifest themselves as ordinary men and engage in sexual relations. The angel of God appeared to Abraham with two other angels in the form of ordinary men. The Apostle Paul said to treat strangers with hospitality because we are to love one another and you may even be entertaining angels and not know it because they can appear as ordinary men (Hebrews 13:2).

There will be no need for marriage and sexual intercourse in eternity. The purpose of it today can be understood through the application of God's coded language that brings transparency. God is using mirroring to teach mankind about spiritual matters. The man mirrors the first creation in heaven who are princes and experts in law and the woman mirrors the second creation on earth who will be experts in God's theology—we will be a kingdom of priests.
