



NFL Extends Virtual Offseason, **Scraps Minicamps Through June**

The National Football League has extended its virtual offseason, and has also reportedly decided against in-person minicamps through the rest of this month.

According to the NFL Network's Tom Pelissero, the teams were notified on Thursday that the virtual offseason would be extended through June 26.





The NFL has notified teams the virtual period for offseason work will be extended through June 26, but there will be no in-person minicamps this month, per sources. Expected, and now official.

Pelissero added that teams could extend their virtual offseason if they so choose, or discontinue it, as some are already doing.

"The NFL and NFLPA continue to work together on remaining protocols to create a safe reopening for training camp," Pelissero reported.
