Dear Friends,

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia! May the one holy catholic and apostolic church unite as one and celebrate!

Unfortunately, it is not that simple. There are deep divisions within the Church. Arguments over the centuries have led to many different traditions within the Church. These arguments have led to labels such as Lutheran, Roman Catholic, Methodist, Episcopal, Baptist, Presbyterian, Church of Christ, Charismatic, Orthodox, Pentecostal, and others. And there are many divisions underneath each of these labels as well. We may proclaim that we are a part of the united Church, but this union is difficult to see when we are surrounded by these labels and divisions.

So how can we see unity within the Church? One way we can see it is within the ELCA's full communion agreements. As a denomination, we have declared that the theological differences between the ELCA and the United Methodist Church, the Episcopal Church, the Reformed Church, the Moravian Church, and the Presbyterian Church – USA are not church-dividing issues. We can share our pulpits and our altars, trusting that

leaders from these denominations will properly proclaim the Word and properly administer the sacraments.

We also see unity within the Church through our companion synod and domestic partner synod relationships. As the ELCA Indiana-Kentucky Synod, we work with the Huria Kristen Batak Protestan (HKBP) of Indonesia, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Chile (IELCH), and the ELCA West Virginia – Western Maryland Synod, sharing the joys and challenges of ministry with one another. We walk together on our ministry journeys, sharing what we learn and learning from the experiences of others.

And we see unity as local congregations gather together for shared times of worship and prayer. On Thursday, May 2nd, we will gather at Versailles Town Square to observe and participate in the National Day of Prayer. If you join us at 12:00 pm, you can leave with a free hot dog lunch; if you join us at 6:00 pm, you will find a prayer gathering that welcomes the presence and participation of children. I invite you to join me at one or both of these observances of the National Day of Prayer.

Through these things, we can see the Church united as one. We may not be exactly the same, but we are united together because, through the sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion, we are united with Jesus, who draws all Christians into the one Body of Christ.

CHURCH COUNCIL

MARCH 17, 2019

After Worship on March 17, 2019, the following met: Marie White, Linda Cutter, Joan Rohrig, David Lawrence, Bob Hunger, Pastor Black, and Peggy Mix. The meeting opened with devotions offered by Linda Cutter.

The secretary's report had been sent to members by email. The minutes were approved as presented. The treasurer's report was presented since Ed was not able to attend. Joan found a \$500 grant that has not shown up for her. Other than that, her numbers agreed with Ed's. On Ed's report, the grant was included and marked as "RRCF Grant." That needs to be changed to "RCCF Grant." The report was approved with those two changes. The following funds have the balances listed:

The financial secretary's report was approved as presented.

Old Business

The Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for April 20. Marie asked if the additional families have been invited. Pastor said that Deanna and the Youth Group are making plans for that. Marie asked for confirmation to be sent to council members.

David will check with Deanna about where the Lenten and Easter donations will be going. He will let us know this week if she has decided on where the offerings will be directed.

WELCA has decided to purchase a new washer and dryer set for the parsonage.

Bob reported that the Mutual Ministry Committee is being organized. Of the people asked to join so far, one has agreed; one has declined; one is undecided yet. Members so far have met and agreed that this should be an evaluative body to look at events after they've happened. They will assess how successful these were and where those events can lead.

The Grounds Committee needs to meet soon to settle flooring issues. The Get Dry company has given a quote that includes fixing the outside drainage for \$17,000. A plan needs to be developed, so the committee will meet Tuesday evening at 5:30.

Halcomb's has sent a bill for the flooring. The motion was made to pay half of it now before the project is finished. The motion passed.

The issue with the Church Windows program has not yet been resolved. In order to use the online version, a credit card is required for the payments to be made. Members questioned if electronic checks would work as well. Joan will check with the Friendship State Bank about opening a card through them and keeping a small balance on it to keep from members carrying balances on their own accounts until they can be reimbursed. Pastor will check on the options in the ELCA credit union. This item will be tabled until the next meeting.

David Lawrence and Linda Cutter will be our representatives at today's synod meeting here at Olean.

New Business

The mowing jobs need quotes. David will check with Matt West about whom to contact. If he cannot give any leads, David will call Trader to see who bought his business. The quotes need to be in by April 14th.

The next Quarterly Meeting is scheduled for April 28th. That is also the date for Rogation Sunday, the mortgage burning, and a 5K walk/run to raise money for Darla Jacobs's scholarship. Normally, a meal is planned for Rogation Sunday. This year to make room for all these events, no meal will be planned. To plan for the God's Work, Our Hands project, next year's seniors at South Ripley will be asked if they

are planning a service project that might use our support. The committee will meet Tuesday, April 2nd at 5:30. A notice will be going into next month's newsletter to ask for help with planning a project. Pastor gave more information about the speakers who will be presenting during Lenten services. The speakers coming in are members of organizations who will share what the organization is about and how they are active in the community. On the final week, Pastor will ask us to evaluate how the speakers have impacted us.

Marie noted that a TV for downstairs needs to be purchased before VBS, which is tentatively scheduled to start July 6th. David is pricing TVs at Walmart and at Best Buy. A wall-mount one for around \$300 is what is deemed most appropriate. A separate DVD player will probably work better than a TV that has a built-in player.

The meeting was closed with prayer.
