Dear Friends,

I am writing this article at the end of a week the nation has spent remembering and celebrating the Apollo 11 mission, during which humans walked on the Moon for the first time. Many gathered in Washington D.C. to view a recording of the launch that was projected onto the Washington Monument. Even the ELCA got into the celebration, sharing stories of Buzz Aldrin receiving Holy Communion on the Moon and the Lutheran (LCA) Chaplain who helped to welcome the three Apollo 11 astronauts home.

What we are not talking about is what has happened to the space program since 1969. We went back to the Moon a few times, but then we stopped. We launched Skylab only to abandon it a few years later. With other nations, we built the International Space Station and keep at least one American astronaut at the station at all times. The federal government got out of space flight altogether. Now a handful of private companies are testing reusable launch vehicles and creating plans to offer commercial flights into space for both people and cargo.

The Church has also gone through a lot of ups and downs over the last 50 years. The 1960's were a time of rapid church planting as congregations took advantage of cultural assumptions of Christianity and high birth rates to welcome many adults, teenagers, and children into worship. In the 1980's, church attendance started turning in a negative direction, but most congregations still showed solid numbers for finances and membership. By the 2000's, a combination of scandals rocking the Church, an explosion of youth sports, and an increasing distrust of institutions of all types started a downward trend across congregational and denominational lines, though some areas of the Bible Belt were exempt until the 2010's. Now, many congregations are struggling to get by, and a growing number are closing their doors.

Many have attempted to answer the questions regarding what we should do now. In my opinion, two of the best answers come from the Rev. Karl Vaters and the Rev. Rachelle Brown. The Rev. Karl Vaters encourages all congregations, especially "small" congregations, to focus on the congregation's mission

instead of the congregation's numbers. While a focus on mission may not lead to a rapid growth in membership or finances, a focus on mission will keep congregations healthy and faithful to their purpose while also being a blessing to their communities. The Rev. Rachelle Brown recently wrote about where the Church finds itself today (<u>https://wetalkwelisten.wordpress.com/2019/07/24/the-spirit-of-our-guestions-oh-and-we-might-be-nicodemus-rev-rachelle-brown/</u>) and concluded with this gem:

"If we are going to be the spiritual people, created by God, seeking to follow the teachings of Jesus then we need to focus on being Christians first. Because when we are Christians living a spiritual life, anything that flows from it, in word, deed, song, prayer, worship, or ritual becomes a light, creating a place for people to gather, ask the hard and confusing questions, receive love, be filled with hope, and experience new life."

As we continue to face the challenges of a rapidly-changing world and a continued distrust of institutions, I pray that we continue to focus as a community on the congregation's mission in our community and as individuals on being Christians first. As part of that focus, I invite you to extend an invitation to your family members, friends, and neighbors to join us for Sunday morning worship services, this month's church picnic, next month's "God's Work, Our Hands" service project, or any other part of the congregation's mission and work in our community.

We have found that this is a place where we can gather, ask questions, receive love, be filled with hope, and experience new life. There are many who are looking for a place where they are welcomed and where they can have these types of experiences as well. So let's extend the invitation and share the chance for others to gather in God's presence and experience new life! *Pastor Curtis*

JUNE 16, 2019

St. Paul Church Council met at 8:00 a.m. on June 16, 2019, in the educational unit. Present were David Lawrence, Bob Hunger, Joan Rohrig, Pastor Black, Linda Cutter, and Peggy Mix. The meeting was opened by Pastor Curtis offering a prayer.

The secretary's report needed to correct the spelling of the seminarian who will lead services on June 30th. After that change, the report was approved as presented.

The financial secretary's report was shared by Joan. The balance in the checking account still looks healthy. The report was approved as presented.

Pastor highlighted several parts of his report. VBS will correspond with ELCA world hunger's week of July 7-11. The following week will be the week of helping with lunch at Pangburn Park.

Today is the last Sunday we will use the "Now the Feast and Celebration" liturgy. Next week we will return to Setting 2 in the green hymnal.

<u>Old Business</u>
