Even as we prepare for a new project for this year (see details in another section of the newsletter), we plan for this project with a healthy building fund.

But as we have focused on funding these projects and maintaining our building fund, we have lost focus on our general fund, by which we maintain and support the ministry of the congregation. Perhaps this is because we only have so much to donate and we made a choice to do our part to fund the projects mentioned above. Perhaps this is because we donate when we attend worship but do not donate when we do not attend worship. Perhaps this is because we have lost a significant number of our members to death in recent years.

Whatever the reason(s) may be for our current situation, our general fund is hurting, and we must ask for your financial support for our ministry. How you choose to respond is up to you. If all you can do is offer one small additional gift, we would gladly welcome your gift and commend your giving in the

spirit of the widow giving two coins (Mark 12:41-44). If you are not in the habit of giving a financial offering when you are present for worship, we invite you to start. If you have a habit of giving when you are here but not when you are absent, we invite you to consider using your bank's electronic banking system to set up a weekly or monthly offering that the bank can submit automatically for you whether or not you are present for worship. If you have made any type of will or financial plan, we invite you to consider arranging for a legacy gift to the congregation (and I can put you in contact with the synod's gift planner to help you make those arrangements).

I greatly appreciate your connection with St. Paul – Olean and your great desire to see the congregation flourish in its ministry within this community. I know that the love many of us hold for this place runs deep within us. We thank you for all that you have done to support the ministry of this congregation, and we thank you for all that you will do in the future to support the ministry of this congregation.

# GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

APRIL 10

"Tenebrae" comes from the Latin meaning "shadows" or "darkness,' so it is a service of shadows. The Tenebrae service makes use of gradually diminishing light through the extinguishing of candles to symbolize the events of Holy Week from the triumphant Palm Sunday entry through Jesus' burial This increasing darkness symbolizes the approaching darkness of Jesus' death and of hopelessness in the world without God. The service concludes in darkness with worshippers leaving in silence to ponder the impact of Christ's death and await the coming Resurrection.

This year, the choir will lead the service with the presentation of "It Is Finished" by Mary McDonald. It includes readings, selections by the choir, and congregational singing. The choir has already begun to work on the music, but will need additional voices to make it make it more meaningful. Rehearsals will continue each Wednesday evening at the end of our regular practice time. Additional brief rehearsals (15 minutes or so) will be held after worship each Sunday. Definite dates and times will be posted later. A link to the music has been posted on the church Facebook page and a CD is available for your use so you can rehearse at home. Additional music will be ordered, but we'll need an accurate count of who will be participating. Singers, please sign up on the bulletin board as soon as you can. Order will be placed on February 17. The invitation to join the choir (and the congregation) will also be extended to local churches. Please share this information with others.

#### ANATOMY OF YOUR OFFERING ENVELOPE

I've had a few questions about what the designations mean on your church offering envelope. Here it is in a nutshell

- Current all monies designated here go in the general fund to pay salaries, utilities, insurance, and other operating expenses.
- Improvement all monies designated here go to pay for general or specific improvements to the church/parsonage.
- Benevolence all monies designated here are sent to the Indiana-Kentucky Synod office for distribution to their ministries as well as a portion being sent to the ELCA.
- \_\_\_\_\_ (Please specify) all monies designated here are placed where you request i.e. World Hunger, Lutheran World Relief, Lutheran Outdoor Ministries, Matt's Mission, Back Door Friends of Faith, just to name a few. This money is held in trust until such time that it can be disbursed to the appropriate entity. (Usually at the end of each month.) Other designations, such as VBS, Music, Playground, Luther League, Relay for Life, etc. are placed in those individual funds.

Offerings in your envelope that are not designated for something specific go into the general fund. Loose offering placed in the offering plate each Sunday also goes into the general fund.

Because St. Paul – Olean does not operate on a set "budget", your offerings go where you choose. If we did operate on a budget, all the money would go into one fund and distributed according to that budget.
