

How to fix Government quickly, easily & cheaply

Further, the department should commandeer projects that have been particularly poorly executed or not executed on at all by other Government departments.
5. The lack of appropriate technological roll-out in the implementation of government policy to the required degree.
6. The general lack of understanding of what government truly is by many in government and those outside government who commentate on it.
