Inappropriate clothing/jewellery/footwear.	AII	Injury resulting from inappropriate clothing or jewellery: Jewellery or inappropriate clothing to be removed before taking part/ Appropriate clothing to be worn including trainers. Hair should be tied back. Students should always wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the dance class. This should not be restrictive or uncomfortable and footwear should support the foot. No mule type, platforms, flip flops or sling back shoes allowed. Hair must be neatly tied back for all classes; any fringes that drop below the eyebrow must be gripped back or a hair band worn.
