FNQG Modern Round-Robin Block Challenge Workshop Led by Diane Roberson April 25, 2024

In April, we will focus on Modern Quilting during the program on April 11th and in the workshop on April 25th. I hope you will use the concepts presented in the program to choose the one block you will make during the workshop.



<u>Goal:</u> Create a 12.5 inch modern quilt block from fabric someone else has brought. You choose the modern block pattern or create your own and you will make that pattern from fabrics belonging to 5 different quilters in a round robin fashion. Practice making your block and ensure you can cut, piece and complete the block within 30 minutes.

What to bring:

Bring your fabric selections that participants will use to create 12.5 inch blocks for you. Place your fabrics in a container that is large enough to root around in and is sturdy enough to be passed around. Each fabric should be no larger than a fat quarter, a manageable size to increase efficiency.

Bring a signature fabric, 5 small pieces that you will add to each block you make as your signature in that block. Do not pass around this fabric.

Bring everything you need to sew a 12.5 inch block.

Please be sure to use good quality thread in a neutral color.

How this works:

You will be sewing in a group and pass your container of fabric to the person on your right.

You will have 30 minutes to cut out and construct a block with that person's fabric, remember to add your signature fabric.

At the end of 30 minutes, place your block into the container with the fabric it was made from and pass to the next person on your right.

Another 30 minutes will be given to create the same block you just made with someone else's fabrics, and so on.

Schedule:

You must arrive promptly at 9:00 am and we will begin sewing at 9:20.

Block 1: Start 9:20 – 9-50 end Block 4: Start 11:30 – 12:00 end

Block 2: Start 10:00 – 10:30 end Block 5: Start 12:40 – 1:20 end

Block 3: Start 10:40 - 11:20 end

Relax and enjoy, this is going to be fun. You can complete the project by adding more blocks or as you wish.
