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Supply List for all three block techniques:

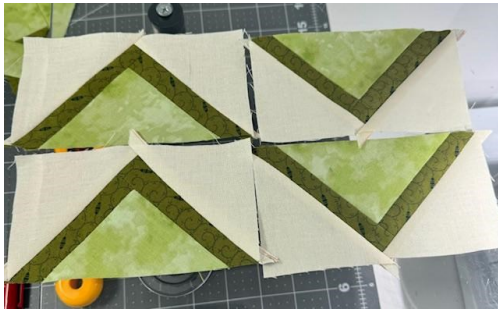
Sewing Machine in working order – don't forget your foot pedal and cord.

Thread

Ruler, Rotary Cutter

Regular sewing supplies you think you'll need

Stroked Flying Geese:



Fabric requirement and cutting instructions to make the four blocks:

- Four (4) 4-1/2" squares in a medium color
- Two (2) 4-1/2" x 2" strips in a darker coordinating solid or reads like a solid
- One (1) 10" x 2" strip in the same darker coordinating solid
- Four (4) 3-3/8" squares in a natural color

Geese Migration:



Fabric Requirements and cutting instructions to make one block. You can choose a color like I did with all greens or go completely scrappy.

- Ten (10) 2-1/2" squares in a solid
- Fifteen (15) 2-1/2" squares in a print – draw a diagonal line on the back from corner to corner
- Five (5) 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles in a print

Scrap Bin Geese:



Fabric requirements and cutting instructions to make one block:

- Twelve (12) 2-1/2" squares (I used the green to stay with my theme) – draw a diagonal line on the back side from corner to corner
- Six (6) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" print (should be something darker but in the same color way like a gray or whatever you like
- Six (6) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" in a low volume color
